# A Message from the Superintendent



As summer turns to fall, it signals the start of a new school year. I have been extremely pleased with the opening of school as we returned to a more traditional setting for 2022-23.

In August parents, guardians and students were invited into our buildings for a walk-through and orientation. Staff gathered on August 31st

for Superintendent's Conference Day to finalize preparation for students' return. On September 1st, over 2,400 students returned to classrooms—including the 2023 Senior Class along with our newest generation of students, the Class of 2036 at Andrew Muller Primary School. As we opened, the new school year activities were in high gear. Each school building had their open houses as parents and guardians were invited to meet their child's teachers. This fall, 19 interscholastic athletic teams will be representing Miller Place. At the secondary level, 38 clubs are offered that students can choose to join. In the late fall and early winter, clubs will start at both Andrew Muller Primary School and Laddie A. Decker Sound Beach School.

The district celebrated spirt week beginning on September 12th. Students dressed up each day of the week to display their spirit: Pajama Day, Tropical Tuesday, Wacky Wednesday, Throwback Thursday and Friday Spirit Day. The last day of the week included a Pep Rally at the high school. The culmination of spirit week came on September 17th with the Homecoming Parade and football game. #### NEW LITERACY SERIES PUTS READING IN FOCUS AT AMPS

The Andrew Muller Primary School—along with the other elementary grades—has adopted a new language and literacy series this year titled *Into Reading*. The program features an abundance of meaningful and interesting literature, high-quality guided reading material, a workshop approach to its writing instruction, and is aligned to the NYS standards. *Into Reading* is the perfect new program for our students.

Three teachers from each grade piloted this program last spring. This year, students have already begun to enjoy it as they listen and read wonderful text and dig into the target skills that make good readers: new vocabulary words, grammar, story structure, exploring genres and answering small and essential questions found in fiction and non-fiction text. We can't wait to see all the progress our students will make as readers and writers this year.



# NO BIG DEAL—JUST A VIRTUAL VISIT FROM ONE OF THE GREATEST ATHLETES OF ALL TIME AT LADDIE A. DECKER



Here's a story sure to make sports fans of all ages jealous: third grade students in Mr. Mas' class at Laddie A. Decker Sound Beach School recently were paid a virtual visit by Steph Curry, recent NBA champion, newly published children's author, and one of the most decorated athletes of all time.

Reading from his book, *I Have a Superpower*, which teaches readers that any goal is achievable as long as they have heart and determination, Steph Curry provided a powerful message to our third graders. All in attendance were excited to take part in such a fun event!

#### NCRMS STUDENTS ARE GROWING BEYOND EARTH

North Country Road Middle School teachers Laura Opitz and Ian Dowd have registered our grade seven science classes to participate in an endeavor that goes beyond the walls of our building. In fact, one could argue the project is out of this world! Working in cooperation with the Fairchild Tropical Botanic Garden and NASA, our classes will be a part of Growing Beyond Earth (GBE), a classroom-based citizen science project designed to advance NASA research on growing plants in space. It includes a series of plant experiments conducted by students in a Fairchild-designed plant habitat similar to the Vegetable Production System (Veggie) on the International Space Station. With experiments currently in progress in more than 300 middle and high schools across the country, GBE provides a steady stream of valuable data to NASA scientists who are developing technologies for growing food crops for long-duration missions into deep space. Students have the opportunity to present their findings to NASA researchers and administrators during the live, virtual Student Research Symposium. The program correlates



with our transition to the new Next Generation Learning Standards in Science. After students follow the experiment that has been scripted for the purpose of research consistent with the other schools participating, they will be given an opportunity to create their own experiments with creative insight developed from their newfound background knowledge.

Two coaches were also inducted, including Salvatore Passamano and Liz Borsetti. Ms. Borsetti, or Coach B, was honored posthumously.

At the induction ceremony, the Miller Place High School Jazz Band performed and volunteers handed out breakfast as guests took their seats for an

intimate ceremony the morning of the District's Homecoming Game. Following the ceremony, the inductees walked through a giant panther arch and through two rows of cheerleaders to be honored on the District's Stadium Field.
