AROUND OUR SCHOOLS

ANDREW MULLER PRIMARY SCHOOL

This year Andrew Muller Primary School has implemented a combined character education and physical education component. On alternating weeks, half of the first and second graders will be participating in a 30-minute Wellness/Yoga activity. The concept of the program is for students to learn to regulate their emotions using mindfulness techniques. Through discussion and exercise, students are learning that their brains are in control of their actions. While young children tend to be impulsive, AMPS students are learning that by slowing down their breathing they can re-focus and make thoughtful choices about their actions. While one half of the class is participating in a wellness activity, the other half remains in the classroom with their teacher. This provides an opportunity for more individualized instruction. The Wellness/Yoga



Program is being run by one of Miller Place's new physical education teachers, Jessica Scheno. Ms. Scheno has come to Miller Place with experience teaching mindfulness to young children.

LADDIE A. DECKER SOUND BEACH SCHOOL

It was a fun and exciting Spirit Week at LADSBS! The majority of staff and students participated in one if not all of the school-wide festivities. An example is a collection of Ozobots, small smart toy robots that allow students to code, play, create and connect the physical and digital worlds. The movement started on a smaller scale last year, but it has taken off the first few weeks of school! A special thank you to Mrs. Ronnie Farrell, who has led the MakerSpace movement in the middle school and expanded the initiative to opportunities in our new Library Media Resource Center.

MILLER PLACE HIGH SCHOOL

Miller Place High School students recently collected more than \$9,000 to support cancer research during a spook-tacular Halloween-themed dance—a Monster Mash at MPHS! The dance was held in memory of Joshua Faithfull, a Miller Place student who passed away in March 2017 following a rare malignant melanoma of the brain and spinal cord. 
