Good evening Miller Place School District Community,

We hope this email finds your family well and finding time to enjoy the fall season. As we are approaching the end of the second month of the 2021-22 school year, we wanted to take the opportunity to update you on two important items.

As you may be aware in May, June and July, the district was advised we would be receiving various Federal and state stimulus grants for the 2021-22 and 2022-23 summer and school year programs. The district discussed and presented our plans to the school community on several occasions. Academic Support Center within the instructional day NCRMS	Provide students extra help on their lunch period during the school day	Pending – limited available staff – reviewing scheduling for this year and for the 2022-23 school year
Increase Math Academic Intervention (AIS) at NCRMS	Provide students additional math support as a scheduled period	In process – reviewing current student needs
Academic Support Center within the instructional day at MPHS	Provide students extra help on their lunch and free periods during the school day	Pending – limited available staff – reviewing scheduling for this year and for the 2022-23 school year
Advanced Placement summer prep program MPHS	AP students skills review for upcoming 2021-22 enrolled courses	Pending – no available staff for summer 2021 – review for summer 2022 implementation
Special Education Summer Reading Enrichment	Special Education student support in grades 6-12	Completed
Increase Behavior Counselor support	Hire four additional counselors for grades K-12 (one per school)	Completed

Increase Nursing support	Hire one additional School Nurse	Completed
Increase custodial support	Hire additional custodial staff	Completed
Increase IT support services	Hire additional technology support	Completed
Classroom ventilation systems	Review Systems for HVAC upgrades	In process pending 10/19/21 bond issue proposal
