

Board of Education Policy

STUDENT AUTOMOBILE USE

The Board of Education permits district high school students to operate automobiles on the premises of the high school provided that certain conditions are strictly adhered to. In order for a student to be allowed to drive to school and operate his or her automobile upon the high school premises and/or district property, he or she must:

1. Possess a valid New York State Class D driver's license; and
2. Possess and display a valid New York State registration, inspection sticker on his or her automobile; and
3. Possess a valid insurance card for his or her automobile; and
4. Attend and complete the District's Safe Driving Course;
5. Possess and display a valid school-issued parking sticker on his or her automobile; and
6. Comply at all times with the following limitations:
 - a. Eligible students may only drive their automobiles on district premises when driving to and from school for the purposes of attending classes and other district functions;
 - b. Students shall park only in marked parking areas and shall not park in sections of the parking field which are reserved for the faculty or staff;
 - c. Students shall not loiter or congregate in or around parked automobiles;
 - d. No student shall permit the transfer of his or her school issued parking sticker to any other vehicle, and no student shall permit the use of his or her automobile on school premises by any other driver except an adult member of the student's family for the purposes of transporting the student to or from school or, with administrative approval, to or from a district function.
 - e. All automobiles shall be operated in a reasonable and safe manner, on all district property and on the access road to and from the high school (Memorial Drive);
 - f. Students shall obey the directions of staff as well as such other and further rules and regulations as may be adopted from time to time relating to automobile use.

Students shall remember that student driving and parking of automobiles at the high school and/or on district property is a **privilege and not a right**. Accordingly, such privilege may be revoked in cases of any violation of this policy or of the Student Code of Conduct.
