From the Chromebook Initiative page: Access to the Internet using school-issued Chromebooks is also filtered through this same cloud-based filter service regardless of where the access occurs - at school, at home, or on any other network. Parents can sign up for weekly filter reports by visiting their school's website and clicking on the Parent Relay Sign-Up under QuickLinks.

Gaggle

In 2020, the district implemented a tool for real-time monitoring called Gaggle. Gaggle is an industryleading, machine-learning technology that pairs with trained professionals to constantly evaluate student content (in grades 9-12) for potentially harmful content, emails, messages, documents, images, and more. If potentially objectionable content or a potentially harmful situation is discovered, Gaggle alerts school officials and assists them in the discovery process. Gaggle will be used in conjunction with your child's school Google account.
