- a. Mt. Lebanon School Board-Sarah Olbrich
  - i. Superintendent Search- Erin (coordinator) 25 applicants right now and close March 15. Search firm will decrease to 10. Timeline is on track for May 1 appointment w July 1 start date
  - ii. Budget season is upon us 80% of our budget is our staff. Charter School reform We pay approx. \$400 thousand for our students to attend
  - iii. Questions

- 1. Nov 2021 We talked about the state of our playgrounds. Where does that stand- We (SB) have added a Capitol project plan for the playgrounds it is building every year and as things fail, they can be replaced. Currently all playground equipt is safe or was removed. We do have a certified playground inspector on staff.
- Teacher contract talks- complicated and takes time even through June 30 is end of current contract we don't foresee a delay in start of school
- 3. Why advertise for Asst Superintendent of Elementary now? We want to have a pool of candidates ready for the new Superintendent. We are not currently selecting one.
- 4. Charter Schools- How many kids attend and why? Do we hold exit interviews with those who left? \$4-5K per student with about 35 kids attending currently. 19 kids are in our cyber program. We have not seen any trends except for refugee families due to ethnic settlement in Baldwin that have carried over to MTL

Over the last month, we've received more information regarding Lithium-Ion batteries and how to handle them when they fail. If you have a mobility device with a large battery, charge it in the garage or outside, do not use refurbished or damaged batteries, and use the manufacturer's charging devices.

As we trade ice and snow for wind and rain, please be safe and avoid downed trees, flooded roadways, and downed wires. Call 911 for low-hanging or downed wires regardless of whether they appear to be electrical, cable, or phone lines. All of them are dangerous until proven otherwise. If the area is blocked off with fire line tape, DO NOT ENTER!
