


A LETTER FROM THE HEAD OF SCHOOL JAMES MILFORD

There is also rapid growth of our Concentration Programs in our Upper School, which has allowed our students to lean into those areas that interest them and find exciting projects to stretch their minds and abilities. We continually look to add academic concentrations and independent studies to allow more options for our students to explore, and to partner with and find topics and projects that fascinate and inspire them. At last count, 65% of our juniors and seniors were taking part in one of these exciting new programs.

Amid all the growth in programs, additional opportunities, and goals of an ambitious Maclay, one that may go unnoticed outside the school is the explosive growth of the performing arts, specifically the orchestral program. We implemented a Fine Arts Strategic Plan several years ago that focused on systematically adding to our offerings and faculty with an eye to building a program that would guide an appropriate facility in the school's future to hold the exceptional talent and dreams of our students and faculty. In the last four years, our orchestral program has advanced from only individual off-campus instruction to on-campus, dedicated curricular time. Our Music on the Plaza concert in December showcased over 100 performers, all of whom received instruction on campus as part of our program.

As we emerge from a couple of years of complications and unpleasant realities, Maclay is making a solid impact by providing opportunities to excite and engage our students, expand into our community to find ways to leverage our talents and resources to help Tallahassee, and continue to look for new opportunities to serve our students and our families better. The landscape our students are living in and graduating into is changing rapidly. We are committed to preparing them for this world with an eye to the future, firmly rooted in the virtues of what has made Maclay successful all these years.

Center for Academic Excellence

The New CAE

The Center for Academic Excellence opened the 2022-23 in a brand-new space. The million dollar-plus renovation of the 'old' science building created versatile spaces for the CAE staff and learning specialist team. In the afternoons, the CAE is busy with the MARC (Maclay Academic Resource Center) which provides free academic support to all Upper School students, Lower School Enrichment Classes like Lego Robotics and Math at Maclay, or on Wednesday you can find faculty professional development workshops.



MATH AT MACLAY



Expansion of Enrichment and Academic Competitions

A primary focus of the CAE this year has been to increase opportunities for academic enrichment. This pursuit has led to the addition of a Fifth Grade Math Enrichment Course and the participation in John's Hopkins Center for Talented Youth courses for students. In addition, new offerings hosted by the CAE through Level Up include "Math at Maclay" a collaborative, hands-on program for Lower and Middle School students intended to deepen number sense and reinforce concepts, and "Lego Robotics," a stem-based Lower School enrichment program. Math teams in all three divisions have been practicing and competing in both local and national competitions and will host a local competition on campus in February. The new Middle School Robotics team also successfully hosted and competed in a regional competition in December.



Professional Development

The Wednesday professional development program is an opportunity for teachers to work with teams of colleagues to examine issues related to teaching and learning. The focus for 2022-23 is "Preparing for Each Student" and centers on identifying strategies to increase accessibility and engagement for all our students. As part of the school's commitment to continuous growth and improvement, teachers are collaborating this year in both Vertical Pk-12 Department Teams and in Professional Learning Communities to explore professional practices and use data to inform instructional choices. Finally, teachers are learning more about the Universal Design for Learning approach through the CAE Workshop series that highlights learning variance and related instructional strategies for the classroom. The fall workshop topic was students with ADHD or ASD (Autism Spectrum Disorder) and the spring workshop is on evidence-based strategies to address reading challenges.

The Maclay Academic Resource Center (MARC)

The MARC has a new home in the CAE, and it is truly the learning hub for Upper School students during FLEX. The free resource center is staffed by Upper School faculty **Lauren Fantle, Will Perry,** and **John Gussaroff** as well as peer tutors. MARC support has expanded their workshops including SAT and ACT prep courses and other small study groups.

ATHLETIC

VOLLEYBALL

The Marauder varsity volleyball team finished with a record 14-11, including a big win over Meridian Road rival North Florida Christian. Senior **Olivia Greenberg** was named All Big Bend Second Team and led the Marauders in both kills per set and hitting percentage. The home finale featured a 6 o'clock showdown when Maclay defeated the Walton Braves 3-0.

CROSS COUNTRY

Maclay cross country continued to be among the most elite teams in the state. The boys were led by senior captain **Clayton Knox**, an All Big Bend First Team selection, and the girls by **Gracie Koeppel, Lillian Koeppel**, and **Caroline Couch** also All Big Bend First Team. The girls finished fourth in the state championship and won the district tournament. Coach **Angie Milford** was also named the All-Big Bend Coach of the Year, capping off another great cross country season.

BOYS GOLF

Under the direction of head coach **Joe Kupiszewski**, the boys golf program concluded the fall season at the Regional Tournament. **Lee Poppell**, who signed to play at Troy, led the team this season winning the Big Bend Championship Individual title, the District Championship title was named the *Tallahassee Democrat*'s Player of the Year.

GIRLS GOLF

The girls golf team finished the regular season with an impressive 11-1 record and placed 5th in the regional tournament in Jacksonville. Junior **Ellie Jane Riner** and sophomore **McClaine Ulrich** led the way for the Marauders, as both were named All Big Bend First Team. With a wealth of young talent and leadership of next year's upper classmen, the future of the girls golf program is certainly bright.

FOOTBALL

This year, Maclay welcomed new Head Football Coach Jason Cauley to Tallahassee. The Marauders finished with a 4-7 record but featured a final senior night victory over the Rocky Bayou Crusaders 42-0 under the lights of Frank Shaw Field. Senior quarterback Michael Grant, All Big Bend Second Team Offense, broke the program record with the most completions in a season (156), and senior Peyton Naylor earned All Big Bend First Team Specialist. Grayson Oberste earned All Big Bend Second Team Offense, and his leadership certainly motivated the team from summer workouts to the final play. The Marauders look to countinue the growth under new leadership and return to championship contention.

SWIMMING

The Maclay Swimming and Diving team had a great season, which included breaking five school records. Both the boys and girls were the runner-up at the district meet, and eight Marauder swimmers qualified for the 1A state meet. **Bella Ekk** broke two school records and was named the All Big Bend Swimmer of the Year. There is no doubt that Maclay swimming and diving will continue its tradition of success in the seasons to come.

Maclay Athletic Hall of Fame

Maclay School hosted its 7th annual Maclay Athletic Hall of Fame Induction and Distinguished Alumnus Award Ceremony officially recognizing the Inductees from 2020 at a luncheon on Saturday, October 22nd in the Dining Hall and Performance Center. The 2020 Hall of Fame Inductees included Kara Newell Mathias ('02, Track and Cross Country), Coach Neil Sheppard, (Soccer & Golf), Lee Williams ('12, Multi-Sports), and the 1973 Boys Basketball Team. Jennifer Parker LaVia, Class of 1981 was honored as the Distinguished Alumnus for 2020.





Kara Newell Mathias ('02)

Kara Mathias helped both the cross country and track programs win multiple state titles and become a consistent state championship contender for years after she departed. Mathias competed on eight state championship teams (four in cross country and four in track and field) and was a varsity member for both cross country and track for six years.

Individually, she won two State Championships, one in the 1600m and one in the 3200m. At the same meet, Mathias recorded the fastest 3200m of any classification, making her the overall fastest at the state championships. Her senior year at Maclay she was named "Student of the Year" which was peer-nominated. "Kara's performances were equaled by her leadership as captain of those cross-country teams for two years," her former coach Gary Droze said. "Without Kara, we would not have achieved our status as a dynasty of happy warriors."



Neil Sheppard

During Sheppard's tenure, the girls' soccer team won eight district championships in a row. In addition to the teams' district dominance, Sheppard coached them to three regional championships. In both seasons, the team also reached the Final Four, and in the 1997-1998 season they brought home the State Championship.

Sheppard was recognized as Big Bend Coach of the Year three times. He was named 3A State of Florida Coach of the Year once, and the NCSAA Umbro Girls High School Soccer Rankings placed Maclay as the 10th best team in America. Yet, Sheppard's success didn't end on the soccer field; he also excelled as the varsity boys' golf coach. Under his direction, boys' golf won four District Championships as well as a City Championship. His teams won two Regional Championships and traveled to the state finals four times. Sheppard also won All Big Bend Coach of the Year for golf in 2003. Sheppard retired in 2010, after nearly 20 years of teaching and coaching at Maclay.



Lee Williams ('12)

Throughout his high school career, Lee Williams dominated on the Marauder football field and the track team. As a multi-sport athlete, he set ten school records, all of which are still in the record books today. Williams garnered much recognition for his athletic prowess and was named Maclay track and field MVP and

All-Big-Bend 1st Team member three times. Clutch performances at the FHSAA finals came on top of those accomplishments. Lee won back-to-back state titles in the triple jump and was the 100-meter state champion three years in a row after placing 2nd his freshman year (2008). He medaled a total of 14 times over his four years, placing him as the second most decorated member in the history of the Maclay boys' track and field program. However, Williams's achievements reached far beyond the track. His talents extended to the gridiron where he helped put a young Marauder football program on the map. During his football career, Williams set records for most yards in one season (2,184), most yards in a career (2,606), most rushing touchdowns in a season (28), most rushing touchdowns in a career (32), and most yards per carry in a season (13.7).

1973 Boys Basketball Team

Members of the 1973 team included Tom Cassedy, Charlie Belvin, Larry Allen, Mark Cartee and Allen Long. The team was led by Coach Jack Kelley. The next year Maclay added Mike Lea and Byron Underwood to the roster. Despite not having a gym or weight room and playing all their games away, the relentless efforts of a persevering Jack Kelley continued to build team chemistry. The Marauders began to mold through Coach Kelley's passion to create a winning environment that included hard work, technical skill, tactical skills, and mental toughness. After adding Leon transfer Ric Stoutamire and Jacksonville Episcopal transfer Holt Graves, along with the opening of the Cartee Gym, history was made. The boys' varsity squad became the first athletic team to finish a season undefeated. The team won the inaugural Meridian Road Challenge versus North Florida Christian School which set the stage for a major rivalry in the years to come.

The vision for the Athletics Master Plan has long been a dream of many students, athletes, coaches, alumni, and community members of Maclay School. The spaces laid out in this plan create areas for our community to gather, celebrate school spirit, and host competitive opportunities for teams and individuals in our region. New facilities will be utilized not just by students competing on school teams, they will provide a place for Physical Education programming, gathering spaces, pep rallies, and other school events. These are the spaces where our community unites in shared school spirit.

Phase One of the Athletics Master Plan includes the creation of the new main athletics stadium and field which will include competition space for several of our sports: cross country, football, soccer, lacrosse, cheer, and track and field. Over 16 teams will utilize these facilities each year in addition to our nearly 700 students using these facilities daily for Lower and Middle School Physical Education classes and other outdoor activities.

Phase Two will be the installation of three multisport practice fields. Finally, **Phase Three** will be four basketball courts that will double as covered practice space for all teams, summer camps, and PE students. This will enhance every Maclay student's experience and will be utilized for not only our athletic teams but students' day to day activities.

Throughout these competitive and practice spaces, there are many areas that honor the legacy of excellence in Athletics at Maclay. These spaces will portray the stories and commemorate the generosity and commitment of the families who have made this possible.

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2021-2022 MACLAY FUND IMPACT REPORT

Through the collective generosity of our community, The 2021-2022 Maclay Fund made possible:

VEX Robotics Expansion

Contributions to the Maclay Fund through Giving Day 2022 funded the addition of VEX Robotics Equipment in the Middle School. This equipment allowed for the expansion of engineering design courses and the opportunity for students to compete in design and robotics competitions along with Maclay Upper School students. (VEX Robotics students build their robot from a kit and then use coding to program the controls.) Through the addition of this equipment, the Middle School is now able to offer an introductory and advanced robotics

Lower School Playground Equipment

The Maclay Fund supported upgrades to the Lower School playground including swing sets, slides, a new climbing structure, and a variety of pieces of multipurpose imaginative equipment.

Visual Arts Professional Development

Thanks to the support of Giving Day and Maclay Fund donors, all Visual Arts faculty will be attending the National Art Education Convention. This event is the largest gathering of visual arts, design, and media arts educators in the world for information sharing and cutting-edge professional development in the arts. Maclay history is being made as this is the first time that all Visual Arts Teachers will travel together for this professional development experience.

Fine Arts Expansion Continues

In recent years, The Maclay Fund has supported the continued expansion of the Orchestra and Theatre programs across the three divisions. This year, the momentum continues as we welcomed Millie Seckel to the Fine Arts faculty. Ms. Seckel brings an extensive background in choreography, directing, and teaching. She will work with students in the Middle and Upper School.

This fall, Lower and Middle school Music teacher, Matt Harmon, formed the Lower School Choir. The Choir will focus on individual technique as well as group singing and will perform both in campus events and the Tallahassee Community.

Three years ago, Maclay added an Orchestra program and it has since grown to include students from all three Divisions. The Orchestra's dedicated space within the Cartee Gymnasium was expanded this summer to accommodate the ever-growing program.

STEM Program Expansion

New this Fall, Upper School students interested in the Biomedical Sciences will have the opportunity to take new classes from The Project Lead the Way Curriculum. This curriculum is designed for students interested in the Biomedical sciences and at the conclusion of the program, students earn a certificate which is recognized widely at the collegiate level.

Maclay's STEM program also incorporated an Anatomage Table into the curriculum. The table gives students the opportunity to experience human anatomy and systems within the body for virtual dissection and lessons. The table can be connected to a 3D printer to print medical models as well. Through the support of our generous community, three new 3D printers were purchased for the Beck Family Research Center for use in the Middle and Upper School Science courses that take place in this facility.

Technology

This year, new drone and technology equipment for the iTHINK Production Lab was purchased. This equipment allows events and programs on campus to be livestreamed in real time on Maclay. org/live. The addition of this equipment expands Maclay's footprint globally and allows those unable to join us in-person to be part of the excitement and magic of campus.

Financial Aid

To increase accessibility to more students, additional financial aid awards were given to students who might otherwise be unable to attend Maclay.
