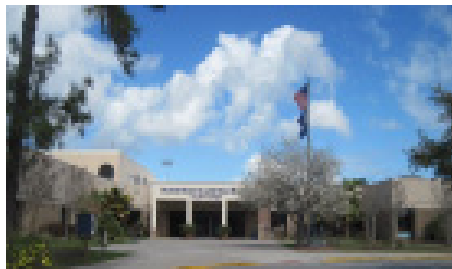

What is the SIC?

In South Carolina, a School Improvement Council is an advisory council to the principal and school on issues related to school improvement. By law, every K-12 public school in South Carolina must have a SIC that is made up of parent, teacher, student (grades 9-12), and community member representatives. The principal is an ex-officio member of every SIC. A SIC may create additional ex-officio positions such as the school’s Teacher of the Year, PTA or PTSO President, or a past SIC Chair.

SIC Goals

Goal 1: Continue Overseeing Referendum Funding for HHIHS Architectural Improvements

ACTIONS TAKEN: • Members of Beaufort County School District Facilities team, including COO Robert Oetting, attended numerous SIC meetings to discuss progress and field questions. SIC also met with various HHIHS administrators to discuss progress and facilitate conversation between the district and the school.

Goal 2: Increase Community Awareness of HHIHS

ACTIONS TAKEN: • Hosted Career Day for our students on March 23rd, with nearly 60 speakers from the community.
• Continue to support the Hilton Head Island High School newspaper, produced by students and teachers, to be distributed digitally and in print to all residents of Hilton Head.

Goal 3: Increase Parental Involvement

ACTIONS TAKEN: • Hosted a Parent Workshop prior to SIC meeting on college scholarships, admission and FAFSA application.
• Updated and revised Parent Handbook for Hilton Head High School parents. Also provided a Spanish version of the Parent Handbook. Continued to distribute handbook at Back-to-School Registration, open houses, as well as available at main office for anyone interested.
• Bilingual liaison presentation in January meeting.

International Baccalaureate (IB) Test Information Diploma Programme (DP) examination results over the last three years

The International Baccalaureate® (IB) aims to do more than other curricula by developing inquiring, knowledgeable and caring young people who are motivated to succeed. The DP curriculum is made up six subject groups and the DP core, comprising theory of knowledge (TOK), creativity, activity, service (CAS) and the extended essay. A minimum score of 4 on the National Standardized IB end of course test is required for college credit.

The ACT is a group of curriculum-based achievement exams designed to measure the academic skills taught in schools and deemed important for success in first year college courses. Scores range from a low of 1 (one) to a high of 36. The 2021-22 average composite score for South Carolina was 18.9
