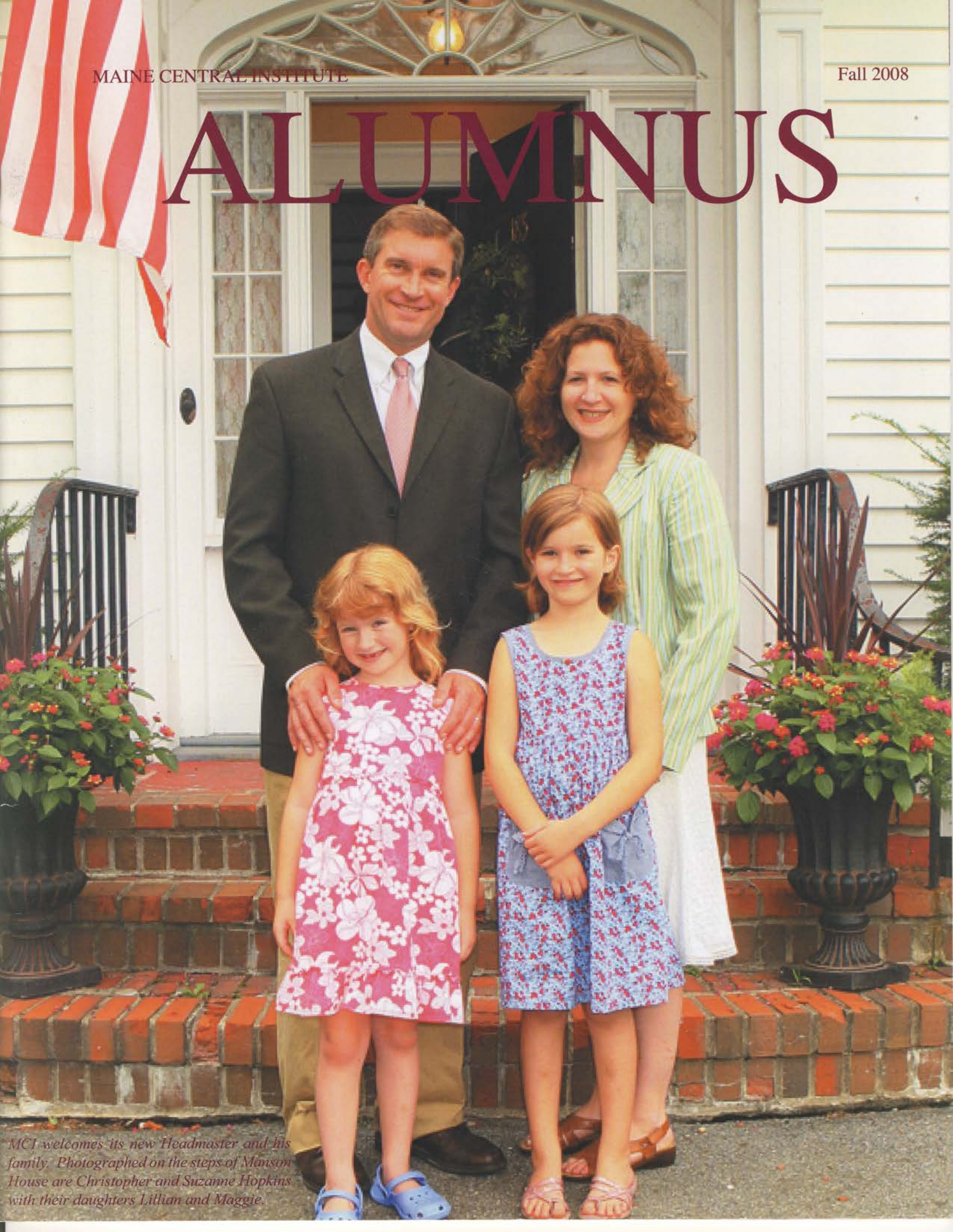

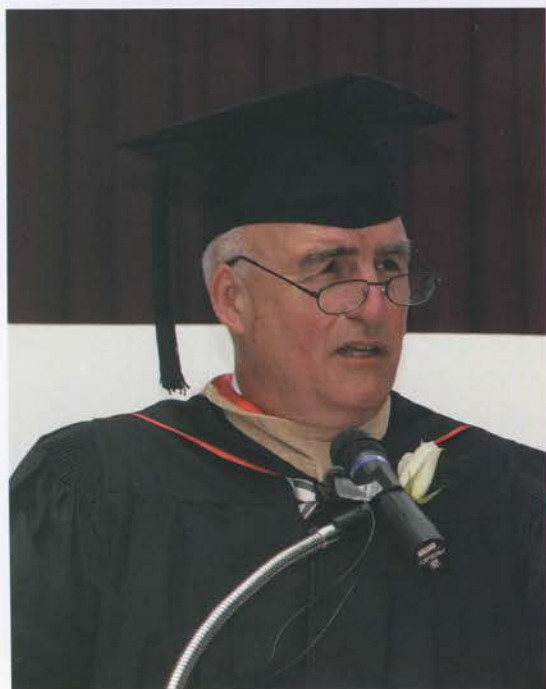
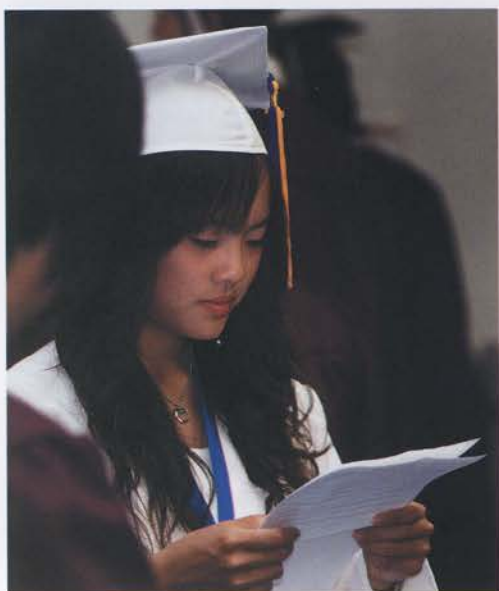
Please come back to MCI, to campus if you can or to an off-campus event if you're nearby. I'll look forward to welcoming you home.

Rebecca Laube '09 Receives AFS Scholarship



Oh, the places they'll go! Just ask Rebecca Laube (MCI Class of '09). Becca moved to Pittsfield with her family in June, 2007 and attended MCI for her junior year. Having come from a high school in Illinois that sponsored American Field Service Intercultural Programs every year, though, Becca just couldn't get foreign travel out of her head. Some of her friends in Illinois had hosted AFS students, and during her sophomore year the AFS students visited the language classes at her high school and talked about the benefits of taking a year abroad. "That very night," according to Becca's mother Pat, "Becca came home very excited and wanted to learn more. She researched AFS last year and wrote her Manson Essay about high school exchange programs."

Where is she now? After a lengthy application process, which she completed entirely on her own, and after an interview in February with AFS, Becca learned in March that she had been accepted for a scholarship to be an AFS student in Germany. She taught herself some German over the summer but spent most of her time working as a lifeguard to save money for her trip.

Becca completed a month of intensive language school in Celle and has now moved to Rheine, where she lives with her host family and takes classes at a German high school. There are very few Americans, and her classes are taught entirely in German. "Just before she left," her mother says, "she was talking to me and was commenting that this is just like what her MCI friends Natasha and Jin do each year when they come to MCI."

AFS is an international, voluntary, non-governmental, non-profit organization that provides intercultural learning opportunities to help people develop the knowledge, skills and understanding needed to create a more just and peaceful world.

Becca will not come home until July, and her family will not be able to visit her, but she keeps in touch through phone calls and through her Shutterfly website, www.germanylauber.shutterfly.com (password lauber).

Garret E. Cole, Class of '68



Galen Cole, father of Gary Cole (Class of '68), first dreamed of having his own museum when he was eight years old. The son of a Maine trucking pioneer from Enfield, Galen hoped that one day he might create a museum that would house some of the working vehicles that he knew and loved so well. Inspired by his father's ambition and work ethic, Galen, who in 1953 became the president of Cole's Express, first broke ground for a modest museum in 1983. Thanks to vision, hard work, countless volunteers and invaluable donations, the expansive and diverse Cole Land Transportation Museum as it exists today has

foundation's primary goal, says Gary, "is to raise the aspirations of kids." A broad, ambitious goal, yes, but Gary and his family, staff, and corps of volunteers have the specifics in place that make that goal realistic and attainable.

Gary Cole went to high school in Bangor but, as he says, "I wasn't disciplined. In order to be successful I needed more focus." During his post-graduate year at MCI, he says, "I studied harder and learned discipline. I did better and came out more focused." Now he directs that focus to the numerous programs sponsored by both the museum and the foundation. For example, when children visit the museum, the museum in turn funds Junior Achievement at their school. Other Education Grant Programs include Leadership School at Kieve; Project Graduation, which grants up to \$1,500 for drug-free graduation parties; Maine Reading Recovery, a remediation program in conjunction with the University of Maine; and the Invention Convention. The Veteran's Interview and Freedom Essay Contest is one of the most successful programs. Each year several thousand students interview Maine veterans and then reflect on these interviews in an essay entitled "What Freedom Means to Me." The winners receive savings bonds.

The veterans themselves are winners, too. The foundation promotes patriotism and civic pride, notably in their distribution of flags to Maine communities and assistance to those veterans in need. Last year at the Bangor Memorial Day parade, more than 500 veterans marched with the walking sticks provided to the veterans through the Galen Cole Family Foundation.

A focus on youth and patriotism may be first and foremost for the Cole family, but that focus long ago widened to include countless and varied needs of communities throughout Maine. They have provided everything from thermal imaging equipment and Iris Scan Technology to money for orthodontic bills. And they don't show any sign of slowing down. Gary himself recently set up a generous endowment at MCI that will focus entirely on funding building upgrades and maintenance.

The sign outside the Cole Land Transportation Museum reads, "The only meaningful legacy we will leave this world will be the difference we made in others, especially in the life of a child." How fortunate for the Mainers who discover all that the museum and foundation have to offer. How fortunate for MCI to call Gary Cole an alumnus.

attracted more than 300,000 visitors from every state and more than 30 countries.

There is so much more to the Cole Land Transportation Museum than trucks, wagons, farm equipment, trains and cars. In 1975 Galen introduced The Galen Cole Family Foundation, of which Gary is the Chairman. The

Kemper Award, the American Society of Civil Engineers Henry L. Michel Award for Industry Advancement of Research in 2007, and election to fellowship from the AIA in 2000 and the Royal Architects Institute of Canada (Honorary Fellow) in 2007. Norbert was also inducted into the MCI Hall of Fame in 2007.

Many alumni who attended MCI from 1941 to 1972 may remember Norbs parents, Norb and Maple, who both taught at MCI.

Peter G. Vigue '65 received one of 25 Top Newsmakers Awards from "Engineering News-Record" (ENR), McGraw-Hill Construction's prestigious news magazine. The 43rd annual awards dinner was held April 3rd at the

New York Marriott Marquis and was attended by more than 1,400 construction industry leaders. As Chairman of the Cianbro Companies, Peter was recognized for creating a new economic paradigm for business and communities. He is transforming Cianbro into a regional manufacturing and economic development powerhouse by investing in shipbuilding, oil rig construction and modular industrial process-plant construction. His goal is to keep ownership and employment local so that areas losing traditional industries can continue creating good-paying jobs that bring workers dignity and benefits.

Recipients of The Award of Excellence and Top 25 Newsmakers were selected from a large pool of nominees who were judged by "ENR" editors to have made the most important contributions to the industry in the preceding year. "ENR" magazine is considered the leader in reporting news, events, trends and analysis in the construction industry.

"Our Top 25 Newsmakers represent individuals who had the vision, fortitude, desire, and in some cases, courage, to make a significant difference in the construction industry," said Janice L. Tuchman, editor-in-chief of "ENR." "They best represent the 'can do' spirit of the industry, and their success is admired by their peers."

Cianbro also recently celebrated the opening of the Brewer Module Facility at the site of the former Eastern Fire Paper mill. The redevelopment of this 41-acre site on the Penobscot River will create more than 500 well-paying manufacturing jobs. The facility will create large modular steel building frames weighing over 1,000 tons used by industrial plants. These prefabricated, self-standing building structures will be outfitted with piping and electrical wires at the Brewer plant, then shipped by barge to industrial clients and assembled onsite.



Peter Cianchette '79 was sworn in on May 8, 2008, as the new U.S. Ambassador to Costa Rica. Prior to this, Peter was Maine's National Republican Committeeman and served as the Maine General Chairman of the Bush-Cheney '04 campaign. In 2002, he was the Republican nominee for governor of Maine.

Peter is president of The Cianchette Group, a public affairs management and business consulting firm. He is also a partner in the Portland-based private investment firm, CHK Capital Partners. He has more than 20 years of business experience, from serving as a senior executive in one of Maine's top manufacturing companies, the Dragon Products Company, a leading manufacturer of cement and concrete to running his own business, Cianchette Enterprises, Inc., which owned and operated Initial Staffing Services, an employee staffing, recruiting, and placement company. In 1998, he joined one of the state's top business and public affairs consulting firms, Pierce Atwood Consulting, where he served as Chief Operating Officer and Executive Vice-President.

Peter served in Maine's state legislature from 1996-2000, representing South Portland and Cape Elizabeth in Maine's House of Representatives. In Augusta, he served on the Joint Standing Committee on Taxation.

He currently serves as a Director on the Boards of the Make-A-Wish Foundation of Maine and YES! to Youth. He also serves on the George and Barbara Bush Maine Cultural Center Committee, the Finance Committee of the American Lighthouse Foundation, and as a MaineHealth Corporator. He has served as Director of the Greater Portland Big Brothers/Big Sisters, the Boy Scouts of America/Pine Tree Council, the Portland Chamber of Commerce and the Southern Maine Community College Foundation. He has also served as President of the Maine Better Transportation Association, and as Chair of the Maine Advancement Program.

Wood for the Neighborhood: Community Wood -- Works!

I was raised in Connecticut, went to college in Massachusetts, and met my husband at The Dublin School in New Hampshire. I have always thought of myself as a New Englander. After living in Maine for five years, however, I realize that southern Connecticut might as well be New York City to Mainers and, well, the other stuff doesn't really count. I am starting to understand that while there's nothing like the good old-fashioned winter we enjoyed last year, there's also nothing like a Mainer.

Here's what I have learned: Mainers are tough. They are hard-working and resilient. They are self-sufficient. They don't sit down much. And they *love* projects. That's why I knew that Chris Hopkins's idea to have a community wood project to support people in need through the winter would work. What I didn't know was how amazing the project would become, how many people would get involved, and how the spirit of the endeavor would set the tone for the entire school year.

Wood for the Neighborhood was created to help keep Mainers warm this winter. The idea was simple enough: people would donate wood, then members of the school community and surrounding area would volunteer their time to cut and split it. The school would then distribute it at no cost to our neighbors who cannot afford to heat their homes. Enthusiasm for the project increased exponentially from the very beginning. In no time we had dozens of cords of wood donated by local citizens and businesses as well as by global companies. Then came the workers: students, faculty, administrators, friends of the school and new friends who were strangers until a pile of wood introduced them. They wielded chain saws and splitters, pushed wheel barrows and formed assembly lines. And soon a bunch of trees became piles to keep our neighbors warm through the upcoming Maine winter.

I know that I'll always be "from away," but that's okay with me. I have absorbed some of the Mainers' ways of doing things, and if I've absorbed even an iota of their work ethic and generosity, I'm much the better for it.

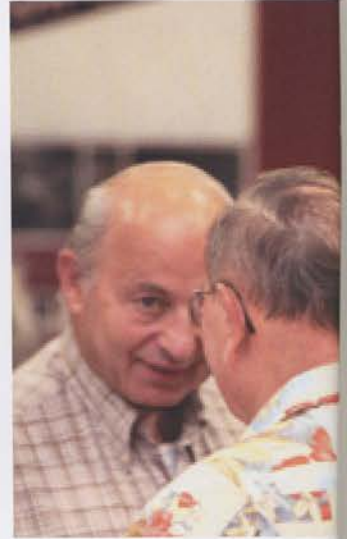
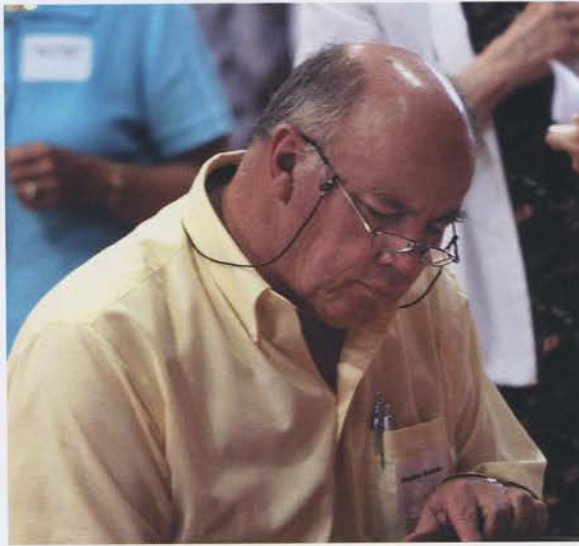

MCI has been home to countless families in its 143-year history. Boarding students have called Alumni and Manson and Rowe home. But so, too, have the families who have come to MCI to teach, coach, and administrate.

Alice and Roy Sinclair made their home at MCI with their daughters Nancy and Sallie. They lived in the boys' dorm while their father was the dorm master until Sallie was four years old and Nancy was seven. They then moved to Pleasant Street, but they never really left MCI. Alice taught Home Economics from 1929-1933 and was the Dean of Girls from 1956-68. She was also a field hockey coach and eventually a trustee. Roy taught Math and coached football and girls' basketball. Nancy remembers, "They were always very close to MCI, even after they left.

They went to see the teams and the plays and always stayed involved. They were both very, very loyal to the school."

Eventually Alice became part of the first group inducted into MCI's Hall of Fame. Roy followed two years later. Roy also became instrumental in the MSAD structure so that all students in Maine could get a good education. As Sallie says, "They were both strong believers in education, and MCI provided the opportunity for them to pass that on." They even passed it on to their own girls, who both became teachers themselves.

In 2001, after Alice passed away, Nancy and Sallie set up the Alice and Roy Sinclair fund to be used to "help people at MCI while they're there," says Sallie. "It can help with tuition or faculty development or with other opportunities such as trips or special activities." Says Nancy, "We set up the fund because we thought it would be a nice memorial to them. "My parents," says Sallie, "just loved MCI."
