From The Head of School



Welcome to Maine Central Institute's 2006-2007 school year! We have had a busy and exciting fall and look forward to sharing with you all of our accomplishments and plans for the future. This school year began with a total of 499 students on campus: 403 from Burnham, Detroit and Pittsfield and 96 students representing 14 different countries and 15 U.S. states.

Our new bi-weekly e-mail newsletter, the "Pawprint," has been keeping friends of the school up to date on exciting happenings around campus. If you haven't yet signed up to receive it, just e-mail us (kdion@mci-school.org) and we'll gladly add you to our growing list. Don't forget our local cable TV station, WMCI (channel 6) and the MCI web site (www.mci-school.org), both of which are a wealth of information. Log onto www.wmcitv.org and you can view video recorded school events right on your computer! To add to our communication endeavors, we've begun a Community Breakfast Series. The first one was co-hosted by Sebasticook Valley Hospital, with Jack May (MCI trustee and CEO of the hospital) and I presenting MCI's benefits to the communities we serve.

On August 5th, I had the pleasure of attending my third Alumni Reunion, where we hosted over 250 people with a wonderful luncheon on the front campus and a variety of activities and class reunions. The annual golf tournament, hosted by the MCI Alumni Association, was also a success. During Homecoming, we hosted a dinner in honor of Peter Brooks '83 as our annual Distinguished Achievement Award recipient.

Please be sure to take note of the dates of upcoming alumni/ae events/receptions occurring in California, Arizona, Florida, Boston, and at Sugarloaf Ski Resort in Maine (see back cover). These reunions are a great way to have fun and stay connected with classmates, meet other alumni, and discover the exciting happenings at your alma mater!

In the area of campus facilities, we continued our renovation of the former Shorey property, creating two new faculty apartments for this school year. Perhaps our newest and most exciting plan is to create an "Honors Dorm" in the old Nye/Hurd house. This renovation will allow twelve of our top residential students to move into a more cottage type atmosphere and work on enhanced transitional skills for college.

Programmatically, we have added two new Advanced Placement courses, AP Chemistry and AP (BC) Calculus. Latin is in its second year and its popularity is growing. We have incorporated an additional reading requirement into the curriculum requiring that students read four extra books each year. We have also started work in conjunction with SAD #53 to assess ways that we can promote character development throughout the MCI curriculum.

In the student activity area, both boys' and girls' soccer teams made it to the playoffs. We have an amazing number of students on the Math Team (46 at last count!) and three of our students have been accepted to the Maine All State Jazz Choir. Approximately eighty of our residential students participated in the Make a Wish Foundation's Walk for Wishes in September, raising needed funds for this very worthy cause. For our tenth year, we hosted over 40 Japanese students from Aomori High School in Aomori, Japan this past October. Five MCI students were able to reciprocate the exchange in early November and had a fantastic experience with our sister school.

As you know, MCI's tuition does not cover all the costs of a child's education, and our annual fund helps support many of these enhancements that benefit our students. Our goal this year is \$140,000, which goes directly to our operating budget to maintain our high standards of educating our students. Our alumni/ae have proud traditions of supporting MCI through the annual fund, and I extend my sincerest appreciation for what you already make possible on this campus. Please join me in making MCI part of your New Year's resolution by giving to our annual fund. Go Huskies!

The Baron of Bayside

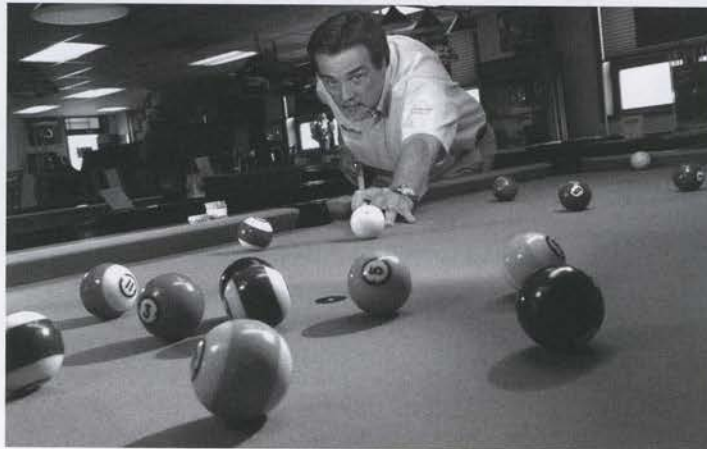
They call him the "Baron of Bayside," and it's a title that fits Ross Furman '63 perfectly. After all, he's taken an area of Portland that was once riddled with scrap yards and decaying industrial sites, given it a name and transformed it into a neighborhood brimming with business, residents and vitality.

Bayside today consists of about 1,000 residents. There's a neighborhood association and *The Baysider* newspaper keeps everyone informed about what's going on. Businesses like a sewing shop, a silk-screen printer, a bank, a supermarket and a video store draw customers and foot traffic, and that's just a small part of what's making Bayside hum and grow.

Furman moved his business, Skillful Vending, to Bayside 29 years ago and he vowed then that he would not be pushed out by rising real estate prices as he was from the Old Port previously. He tried to buy a parcel of property in the Bayside area every year, and 29 years later he owns some 17 buildings, five parking lots and a host of other properties in Bayside and beyond. "I live it, I'm part of it, I will not be sold out or pushed out," he said. "My whole goal here is to turn this into a pedestrian retail area."

The Baron of Bayside is quite a contrast to the Ross Furman who spent three years as a student at MCI back in the early 1960's. "I was asthmatic and weighed 107 pounds," he recalled. "I had no confidence." Furman was a "townie", and came to MCI after Warsaw Middle School. His family moved to Falmouth after his junior year and he graduated from Falmouth High School.

Furman began to follow his dreams while he was a student at Husson



College. "I was on the Student Senate's entertainment committee and I used to book bands for Husson events," he said. "The first act I ever booked was Rex Fowler ('66)." He went on to book musical acts like James Taylor, Carole King, Canned Heat and the Grateful Dead for Husson. "So when I graduated from Husson, that's what I did," Furman said. He began his own business booking shows in Bangor, Portland and Manchester, NH, then he moved out to San Diego to seek his fortunes there. "I spent less than two years in California then came back and began Skillful Vending," he said.

Furman began Skillful as a coin-operated amusement company that supplied restaurants, taverns, lounges and more with amusement machines. In the early 1990's, Skillful opened a showroom for retail sales, and today the first floor of the Alder Street building is chock full of custom pool tables, bar stools, air hockey tables, pinball machines and more. Even with everything else Furman owns and is involved in, he's still running the show at Skillful.

Furman sees his career in the amusement industry as coming full circle. "I played a lot of pool when I lived in Pittsfield," he recalled. "I would play at Frenchie's pool hall

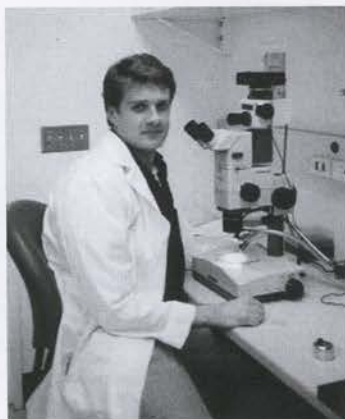
downtown, then in Alumni Hall. People called me a 'pool shark' in my yearbook, and they said that I could make a nickel last all day on a pinball machine."

"One of the things I took from MCI was that I became determined to make sure I had something to offer, to be recognized, to have an identity," Furman said. "I'm more confident today; I don't think there's anything I can't do."

Furman said he sees every day as a new challenge and that he can't imagine doing anything more than twice. He's going to try his hand at raising Alpaca next spring and is working on a new Bayside project that will house 29 artists' studios in an old renovated laundry building. He recently made a major gift to Husson College for a new 4,400-square-foot student center that will bear his name and feature video games, pool tables and performance stage, social areas, air hockey and table tennis. Of the Husson gift, Furman has said, "I want to return something to Husson College because it got me on my way."

Tough, demanding, a perfectionist - Furman admits he's all three. "I'm driven to get it all done in one day, every day," he said. "I've never thought about doing something - I just do what I do and keep going, just keep moving forward." But when will he get it all done? "When do you finish what you need to do?" he said. "I don't think a true entrepreneur ever gets it done, but I have a lot of fun doing it."

Furman lives in Falmouth with his wife Jennifer. He has three children - Victoria, Yates and Morgan, and his first grandchild, Andrew Paul Burke, Jr.



Peter Brooks '83 Receives 2006 MCI Distinguished Achievement Award

Peter Brooks '83 was awarded the 2006 Maine Central Institute Distinguished Achievement Award in festivities held during Homecoming weekend in October. Brooks was recognized for his many contributions to the field of cancer research. Since his graduation from MCI, Brooks has served as an invited speaker in over 85 national and international scientific meetings, has published over 50 articles and book chapters, is a primary inventor on 18 U.S. and international patent applications, is a co-founder of two biotech companies and his basic

research has led to the development of four distinct compounds that are currently in the process of being evaluated in human clinical trials for the treatment of malignant tumors.

Fencing Club Grabs Local Medals

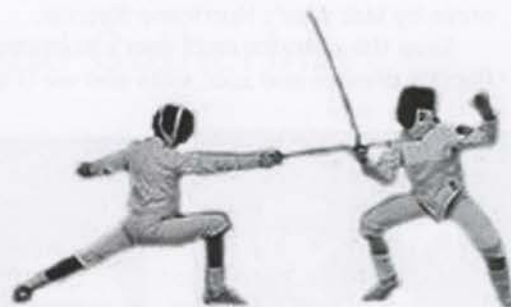
MCI student fencers recently came away with 10 out of 16 medals awarded at two local tournaments.

For the first time, MCI's fencing club is United States Fencing Association certified, a designation which provides additional insurance for fencing activities, but the club is now sanctioned to run USFA tournaments and award ratings to fencers who fence in them.

Taking advantage of the club's new standing, MCI fencers recently ran a tournament hosting eight epee fencers, 12 novice foil fencers, and five novice saber fencers. MCI senior Ketat Sarakune took first place in the novice events, with Mark Smith '07 taking second and Julia Bither '10 tied for third place. In the saber event, Smith earned another silver medal and another MCI senior, Jason Monk, tied for third place.

Two weeks after that tournament, the MCI fencers participated in another tournament in Machias. Smith took the gold medal there, with Monk finishing in second place and Tyson McKinley '10 tied for third. In the saber event, Monk and Smith took home silver and bronze.

"I am proud of the MCI students' fencing prowess and their comportment at these events," said Jim Tyson, MCI fencing club advisor. "They are representative of the best of MCI and I look forward to the rest of the year."



MCI Receives ExxonMobil Grant

Tutorial Services Offered

MCI is offering a new Tutorial Services program this year.

The Tutorial Services program is located on the third floor of Weymouth Hall. Services are available during the school day, or by appointment. Students accessing this service can sign up for as many sessions as needed during study hall.

Sign-up for Tutorial Services require a one-week advanced notice and must be prepaid for the upcoming week's sessions. Tutoring is available in most courses including Mathematics, English, History, French, SAT Prep and Organization Skills. The cost is \$35 per session, or \$950 per 9-week block.

To sign up for tutorial sessions, fill out a form available in the Business Office or in the Tutorial Center in Weymouth Hall. The form must be completed, approved by the tutor and paid for at the Business Office prior to the tutorial session. 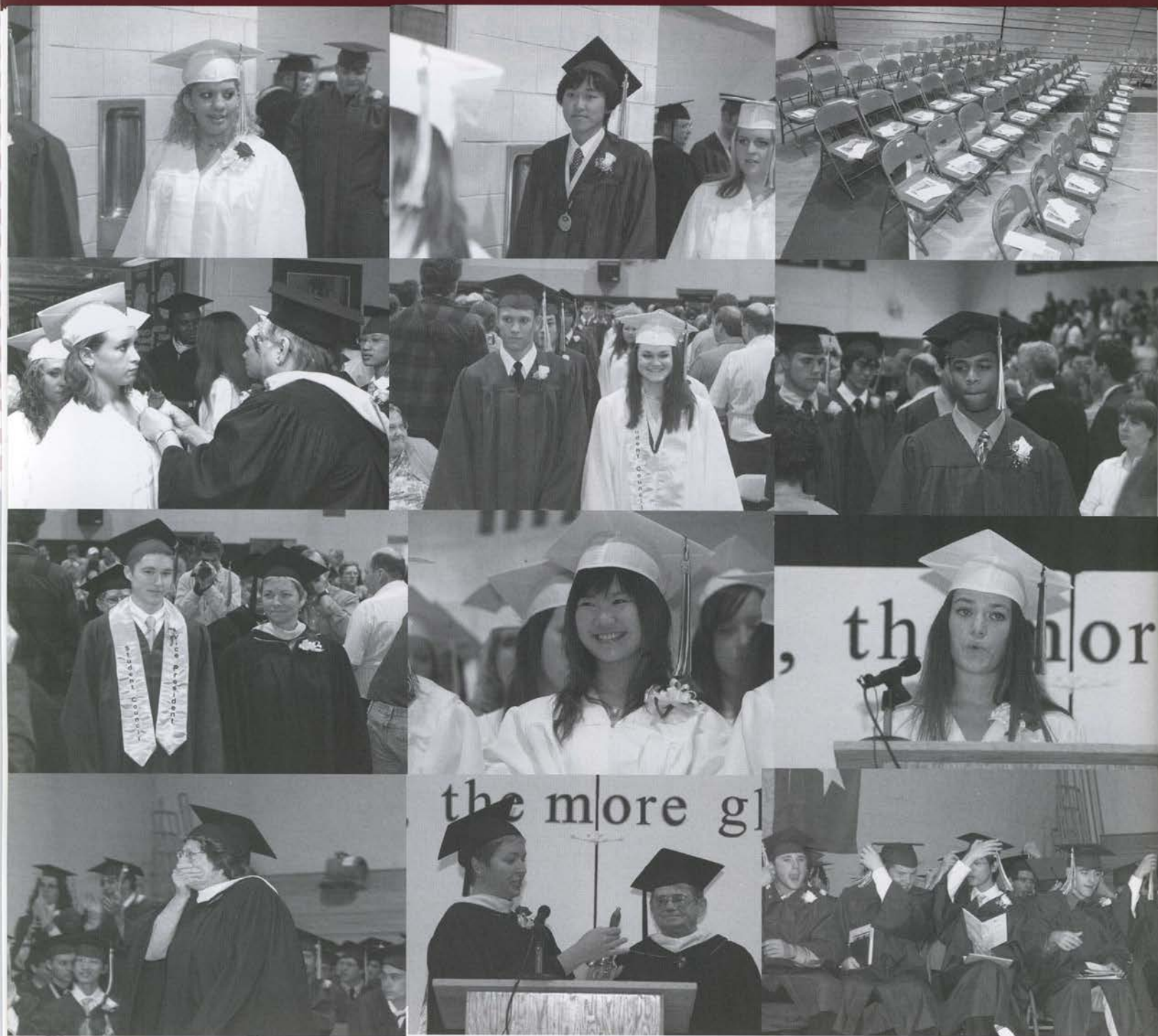
