Never Cry Wolf, by Farley Mowat

Background

Farley Mowat published *Never Cry Wolf* in 1963. The book is a non-fiction memoir of the 18 months he spent in the Barrens, a treeless area of tundra, studying arctic wolves for the Dominion Wildlife Service. Told that these wolves killed caribou for sport, Farley was surprised to discover that wolves never attacked humans and only culled the deer herds of unhealthy animals. Farley also encountered rampant inefficiency among his government colleagues, which he reports in the often humorous, self-deprecating narrative. The book is credited with changing average Canadian attitudes toward wolves and the arctic ecosystem. Widely read, the book was made into a 1983 biopic by director Carroll Ballard.

Characters

Farley Mowat is the book's first-person narrator. Mowat has firm, preconceived notions about wolves and their place in the natural world, but gradually, through his observations and experiences with the wolves, these preconceptions change.

Ootek is native to the area in which Mowat sets up his study of the wolves. He is a minor shaman to his people and has observed wolves closely all his life. Ootek is fascinated by Mowat's project, and the two men become close friends.

Mike is a trapper who owns a cabin and allows Mowat to use it as his permanent base camp. He introduces Mowat to his cousin Ootek.

George, Angeline, their four pups, and **Uncle Albert** make up the family of wolves who become the object of Mowat's study.

Chapters 1-7
