MISSION STATEMENT

MCI pledges to provide a rigorous, comprehensive educational program to a multicultural student body with a wide range of abilities and interests. In a safe and caring atmosphere, students will acquire knowledge, self-esteem, social responsibility and the critical thinking and communication skills necessary for global citizenship and lifelong learning.



*A*s the leaves on the giant maples on the MCI campus turn from green to the brilliant colors of fall, it is exciting to have another school year underway here in Pittsfield, Maine. It is also a time to reflect and give thanks to the many people who have been so thoughtful and generous in supporting the young people here at MCI during the past year. This publication is

meant to serve as a thank you to our many alumni and friends who have given unselfishly of their time and resources to improve the learning opportunities for all of our students. The vision before us becomes clearer and clearer as each day passes, and, as a result of our team's ability to communicate that vision to our students and faculty, we have gained tremendous momentum as an institution.

We are entering our third year of revitalizing our residential program, an effort undertaken for the purpose of creating a younger and more diverse student body on our campus. The residential population numbers 75 students, an increase over last year. We have eight different countries represented and 15 different states. The number of students from Pittsfield and surrounding communities continues to grow on an annual basis as well. Our local student body has increased by nearly 60 students over the past three years. We have had to work diligently to create alternative classroom spaces: two classrooms in the basement of Manson Hall and one in the Technology Center to provide additional space for the Bossov Ballet Theatre, with whom we have become an active partner. This past summer, due to our increases in enrollment, several new staff members have been hired. An additional Humanities/history teacher, a math teacher, and a part-time music teacher have joined our staff. This guarantees that our average class size will remain constant at 15 or fewer students.

The structure developed within our organization in recent years has paid tremendous dividends for us. The service that we have been able to provide students in the area of career and college placement has improved dramatically since the development of our Academic Office. Likewise, the service provided to those students with personal counseling needs has also grown dramatically with the development of our Wellness Office. The number of students participating in co-curricular activities continues to grow. In terms of student participation in activities beyond the school day, we have 156 students participating in athletics this fall and 145 participating in our music and theater programs.

We have also moved forward in terms of compensation for all employees. Through an extensive planning task force last year, a five-plan has been put in place to bring our employees to parity with the local job marketplace. We are in the first year of funding the proposal.

This year, we chose to open the school a little differently. We were excited to have Gregory Patterson '69 serve as our opening of school motivational speaker. Greg currently resides in Los Angeles, California, where he serves as the director of The Beach Club in Santa Monica, is an adjunct professor at Cal-Poly University and is a motivational speaker across the country. Greg provided a tremendous message to our student body and also held a leadership session in the afternoon for all of our student leaders. We were very fortunate to have Greg volunteer to devote this time to our student body, considering he lives on the west coast. We are very thankful to him for all his energies.

In regard to the annual fund this past year 1997-98, we saw tremendous growth in terms of the willingness of people to make unrestricted cash gifts to the institution. For the year ending June 30, 1998, \$97,335 was donated. This reflects an increase of over \$23,000 from donors and parents during the past year. There were 40 new first-time donors. Our total giving for the year exceeded \$234,000 thanks to the many generous restricted gifts that people gave to the institution. A listing of restricted gifts can be found on page 14. Again, we are thankful for their tremendous support of MCI and the overall betterment of education for students here.

During my travels, a common theme became apparent to me. It didn't seem to matter which alumnus I met with, regardless of whether they were from the classes of the 30's, 40's or the 90's, the theme was that as a student at Maine Central Institute, they had the opportunity to learn, to think, and, most generally, to think "outside of the square." Creative problem-solving was a critical part of their educational program. We need to be thankful to those people who have given so much through the generations to make the school what it is. It has made me realize that, as the head, I am a person who happens to be here at the current time. There are many who have preceded me and many who will follow me. The same is true for our Board of Trustees, faculty and alumni. We have an obligation as people to insure that MCI goes on to the next generation in better shape than it was received. The institution itself is far larger than any one of us or any group of us. We are truly a diverse institution that has made its mark for many, many people.


From a strategic planning vantage point, we have continued to work diligently to analyze and determine what we want our future to be. We recognize the need to maintain

quality faculty who are clearly focused on our mission as a school. We want our ratio of teachers to students to remain low. We also feel strongly about our residential program, in that it brings a level of diversity to our local students that they would not experience otherwise. Likewise, our local students bring tremendous diversity to our residential students who come from many different parts of the world. We are fortunate to have both groups as a part of this institution. We do know that from a facilities standpoint, we have weaknesses due to our continuous growth in enrollment. We are exploring the opportunities for an extensive capital campaign to address many of those needs. We know that our science and technology space needs to be improved. We recognize that we have virtually no performing arts space. We have a music building that serves our needs relatively well but certainly is not a state-of-the-art facility. We have a great need for a student center to serve recreational needs beyond the inter-scholastic athletic participation. Our students need places where they can swim, play racquet ball and tennis and participate in other recreational sports. Our dining room is far too small to accommodate our current needs. All of these are critical to making our school the best it can be. A strategic planning retreat was conducted in the spring of this year to assist us in affirming and prioritizing these needs. As more goals are determined by all stakeholders of the institution, we will continue to move that process forward.

I thank everyone for their tremendous support of the institution and the passion you demonstrate to insure that every youngster who attends our school will receive a rigorous curriculum, be challenged to the greatest degree and have the opportunity to go on and be successful as so many of our alumni have done.

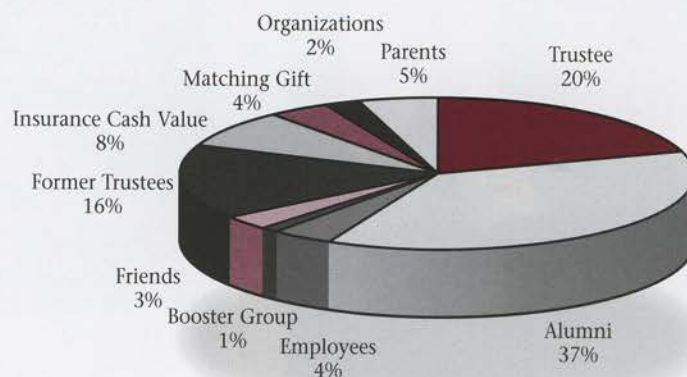

When considering a gift, select the best asset for your personal situation. Good planning in giving makes sense; there are substantial tax differences for each type of gift.

Securities or Real Estate

A gift of securities or real estate that has appreciated can be one of the most advantageous ways of giving to MCI. To provide an incentive, the federal government has allowed for the avoidance of tax on the appreciation of these gifts in most situations.

Bequests

Most people living in the United States die without benefit of a will. The state disposes of their property according to fixed laws, without thought to personal wishes of the deceased. The tax advantage of a charitable bequest may be substantial when considering the Federal Income Estate Tax ruling. The estate tax charitable deduction is unlimited and all estate tax assets given to charity are fully deductible.

Insurance Policy

A gift of an **existing whole life insurance policy** has valuable and attractive benefits. They include:

- a sizable gift without reducing income
- immediate and substantial tax relief
- deductions for future payments
- federal estate tax reduced or eliminated

A gift of a **new policy** with MCI named as the owner and irrevocable beneficiary gives you a charitable deduction for all future premiums including any unexpired premiums for the year of gift.

Name MCI as a **beneficiary** for part of the proceeds of a policy that you will own and control. You do not receive a tax deduction now; however, you may reduce any federal estate taxes because the proceeds are a charitable gift.
