From the Headmaster

Another school year is well underway. I am proud to report that MCI entered its 126th year on a sound financial base and recently ratified a new, 10-year contract with Maine School Administrative District #53 to continue our partnership through the year 2003.

Having started the school year with 93 students, MCI's boarding program enrollment is at its highest level in many years.

You'll be pleased to learn that MCI has been named by the Maine Department of Education as one of nine members of Maine's Coalition of Essential Schools. The nine schools are recognized as leaders in the movement toward educational restructuring.

Over the years, many alumni left MCI satisfied that the school gave

them the education necessary to become happy, successful adults. Today, MCI is faced with escalating educational costs, forcing us to depend more and more on the Annual Giving Fund. This fund of unrestricted cash gifts helps to ensure that today's students receive the same educational opportunities the students of vesterday received. I am thankful for alumni support of the Annual Giving Fund. During the past year, more than \$68,000 in annual giving contributions came to our school. These dollars make the difference between an average high school education and an outstanding one.

Our long-range plan calls for the restoration of Founders Hall, a major renovation of Cianchette Hall of Science, and the construction of a LIFE Skills Center to replace our

industrial arts facility. When will these projects be done? They'll be done when we successfully complete a major capital campaign, possibly exceeding eight million dollars. When should these building projects be done? Yesterday would have not been soon enough, but because of the state of our economy, they may not be completed for several years. When the Board of Trustees feels that it is appropriate to enter into a major capital campaign, then we will do so; until that time, we will continue to strive forward with the facilities we currently use.

I always look forward to talking with our alumni and other interested people about the growth of our institution. It's a great privilege to be a part of the long-range development of Maine Central Institute.

Educational Initiatives at MCI

There is a growing concern about the quality of education in America today. The concern is that we, as a nation, have failed to prepare our young people for the competitive challenges they will face in the twenty-first century.

President Bush's "America 2000" plan, announced in April, 1991, calls for sweeping changes in the educational process, particularly in the areas of math and science. In Maine, Governor McKernan has developed "Maine 2000" to begin the process of restructuring education. At its August meeting, the MCI Board of Trustees' Executive Committee adopted the "America 2000/Maine 2000" concept and committed MCI to its goals.

In conjunction with the Educational Commission of the States and the Coalition of Essential Schools, MCI has joined the Re:Learning Schools Network. MCI and eight other Maine schools or districts have received "innovative" grants to develop model restructuring programs within their schools. With input from MCI faculty, local business representatives, teachers and administrators, a committee of MCI educators has identified specific student needs: communication skills; self-confidence/self-esteem; problem solving/analytical skills; and a strong work ethic.

From this assessment, the LIFE Skills curriculum (Learning and Integrating Future Essentials) was born. Every freshman student is enrolled in the program. Classes meet for two 45-minute periods each morning. In a "team" approach, teachers and students tackle pro-

blems and bring together information from the business, computer, home economics, English, and industrial arts disciplines. By the end of the school year, each student will compile a portfolio to be assessed by the teaching team.

The success of MCI's Humanities program, which integrates history and English (along with art and music), proves that students learn well through an interdisciplinary curriculum. Through a similar approach, MCI's LIFE Skills program seeks to teach our students the essential skills they'll need for the complex and exciting challenges that lie ahead.

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The students, the Board of Trustees, faculty, and staff of Maine Central Institute thank those alumni, parents, and friends who generously supported the 1990'91 Annual Giving Fund. 

Roy U. Sinclair Weight Room Dedicated

On October 3, a group of MCI trustees, faculty, alumni, and other honored guests gathered at Wright Gymnasium for the formal dedication of the Roy U. Sinclair Weight Room.

The late Mr. Sinclair came to MCI in 1926 to teach math, coach football, and supervise the boys' dormitory. He had grown up on a farm in southern Maine, and knew about hard work, discipline, and earning one's own way in the world. Mr. Sinclair worked to instill those values in his young students and players. To this day, he is remembered with respect and fondness by his former students and colleagues. While at MCI, he met and married Alice Webster, the home economics teacher. They raised two daughters, Nancy Sinclair Wilson '52 and Sallie Sinclair Huot '56. Mr. Sinclair left the MCI faculty in 1943, but he remained on the Board of Trustees. He served two terms each in the Maine House of Representatives and the Senate. In the Senate, he sponsored the bill that led to the creation of Maine's system of school districts.

In 1957 Governor John Reed appointed Mr. Sinclair to the Employment Security Commission, a position he held for 10 years. Mr. Sinclair was an active Shriner who served as Potentate of Anah Temple in Bangor.

In the words of Board of Trustees President, Peter Vigue '65, Mr. Sinclair exemplified the principles of "commitment, dedication, and search for excellence as well as any teacher at MCI . . . We will never forget where this school came from or those who made it what it is today."

"The wisdom that Mr. Sinclair shared with young people, and the guidance he gave them in the classroom and on the playing field, enriched their lives. His influence has endured and continues to inspire us today."



Hall of Fame Inductees

One inductee was a young man of another era who graduated from MCI with distinction and went off to serve his country in World War II. He didn't return alive, yet for fifty years he has lived in the memories of his classmates and friends.

The other is a young man of today, a business owner and community leader who is devoted to his family and committed to helping others.

In different ways, Frank Koris and Michael Fendler have each left a lasting impression on the people around them and on their school. At the 40th annual summer reunion on August 3, the Alumni Association honored the achievements of these alumni and entered their names into the MCI Hall of Fame.

The late Frank "Parney" Koris graduated from MCI in 1940 and returned the following year to complete a postgraduate course of study. Admired by the faculty and students for his kindness, sincerity, and school spirit, Parney was the recipient of the first Masters Cup, which was awarded in 1941. In 1943, Parney was killed during a battle in Italy. In the words of his friend and roommate, Robert Moulton '40, Parney was "one in a million."

Mr. Moulton was at the reunion banquet to accept the award for his dear friend, whom he "loved like a brother" and his never forgotten. Bob presented the Hall of Fame plaque to Parney's nephews, Anthony Koris '57 and Frank Koris '63.

Michael Fendler '70 retired in 1991 after serving for ten years as Treasurer of the MCI Board of Trustees. Well-known in the Pittsfield community, Mike was one of five children of Ryan and Barbara Fendler. During his high school and college years, Mike was an avid skier. He and his father were instrumental in establishing the Pinnacle Ski Club; at one time, Mike served as its president.

Mike is part-owner and president of C. M. Almy & Son. Formerly the Mayor of Pittsfield and a Town Councilor, Mike chaired Sebasticook Valley Hospital's capital campaign in 1990.

In his service to MCI as its financial advisor, Mike has given the school an immeasurable amount of time and management expertise. In nearly every corner of the school campus, there is evidence of Mike's generosity. For all of these accomplishments, Michael Fendler has earned a place in MCI's Hall of Fame.

125th Birthday Noted at Summer Reunion

1991 marked MCI's 125th anniversary, a milestone in the school's history. Speaking at the reunion banquet, Headmaster Douglas Cummings drew a comparison between the visions of MCI's founders and today's plans for the school's future.

Headmaster Cummings praised the many individuals who have "helped to chart the course of the school" throughout its history. He introduced Paul Legge, a former science teacher and designer of the Cianchette Hall of Science, and Alice Sinclair, a former home economics teacher and widow of long-time coach and teacher, Roy Sinclair.

Activities during the reunion weekend included meetings and special parties for the five-year annniversary classes. At the yearly meeting of MCI's class agents, alumni exchanged ideas about reunions, class correspondence and alumni giving.

At the Alumni Association's annual business meeting, the following members were elected to office for the 1991-'92 school year: President, Ralph Damren '64; Vice President, Lynne Gould Cianchette '69; Treasurer, Allyn Taylor '66; and Assistant Treasurer, Lori Wyman Glidden '80. The newly elected members to the Alumni Association Executive Committee are Charles Curtis '85, and Aaron Shorey '89.

E. Burnell Overlock

With sadness we note the passing of E. Burnell "Bun" Overlock of Washington, Maine and Winter Haven, Florida, on October 16. Bun was the Class Agent for 1924, a former President of the MCI Alumni Association, and a lifelong friend of MCI. He was the husband of Martha Braman Overlock. He was predeceased by his son, Vincent, in 1989.

Born in Washington, Maine, on December 31, 1906, Bun was the son of Charles and Clara Lermond Overlock. He graduated from Washington High School in 1922, MCI in 1924, and Washington State Jormal School in Machias in 1928. Bun received his Bachelor of Education Degree and Master's Degree in Education Supervision and Administration from Rhode Island College of Education.

Bun was a principal in the Lincoln, Rhode Island school system for 29 years. In 1959, he opened Ponaganset Junior/Senior High School in Foster, Rhode Island, the state's first regional junior/senior high school. His last years of teaching were spent in Bourne, Massachusetts. After retiring in 1972, Bun served for ten years on the Bourne School Committee.

Bun was a 63-year member of Mt. Olivet Masonic Lodge, Washington, Maine and was a member of St. John's United Methodist Church, Winter Haven. His numerous memberships and civic affiliations included: the Society of Paper Money Collectors; Upper Cape Coin Club (honorary life member); Barnard Club of Rhode Island and Rhode Island Secondary School Principals' Association; Retired State, County and Municipal Employees Association of Massachusetts; Bourne Historical Society (Vice President



and life member); scout master and assistant district commissioner in Rhode Island; and planning director of the civilian defense program during World War II. Bun was also a licensed auctioneer in Bourne.

In 1984. Bun wrote and published "Sixty-six Years a Country Fiddler," the story of his father's life. In 1986, he compiled and edited a book of his mother's poems. In 1989, a newly constructed annex to the Lincoln (Rhode Island) Central Elementary School was named in his honor. Mr. Raymond Fontaine of the Lincoln School Committee wrote that the Town of Lincoln "...has never forgotten (Bun's) extraordinary contributions to its welfare..." and that the dedication of the school in his name was Lincoln's "expression of

enduring respect, gratitude and love."

On August 5, 1989, Maine Central Institute awarded Bun its highest honor, induction into the MCI Hall of Fame. Bun was recognized for his life-long commitment to the education of young people and his great contributions of time and resources toward the betterment of MCI. Bun's loyalty to MCI was exemplary.

A memorial service for Bun was held on October 20 at St. John's United Methodist Church in Winter Haven. In his eulogy, Dr. John Few, Pastor, spoke of Bun's love for MCI, his service as a class agent, and his election to the MCI Hall of Fame. Contributions in memory of Bun Overlock may be made to Maine Central Institute. Emily Sinclair '49 expressed very clearly our feelings about Bun:

"a dedicated, caring alumnus . . .
we shall all miss him."
