## From the HE4DMASTER

The 1988-1989 school year has come to a close.

During the past year, alumni activity has continued to grow. The summer Reunion last August was well attended, and the winter Reunion in St. Petersburg, Florida reached an all-time high in attendance. The 1988-1989 Annual Giving campaign also reached an all-time high, exceeding \$60,000 in gifts and pledges. These facts are indications of strong alumni support for our school.

The faculty and students of MCI have experienced a productive year. The Ted Forte program for effective instruction has continued; the program involved nearly one third of the total faculty. I anticipate that more teachers will particpate in this summer's course.

Agifted and talented enrichment program was also initiated this year. Under the direction of Rosalie Williams, Tanya Kingsbury and Debra Torrey, the program offered more

than thirty enrichment mini-courses. Again this year, a large percent-

age of MCI graduates will enroll in colleges this fall. From the postgraduate class, 28 of 31 have finalized their college

plans. Postgrad valedictorian Jay Carroll will attend Gettysburg College in Pennsylvania. Salutatorian Andrew Mignanelli will attend Northeastern University, 60 of 96 seniors who graduated June 4th have finalized their college plans. Among our honor parts recipients, valedictorian Thomas Chadwick will attend MIT, salutatorian Crystal Brooks has enrolled at Cornell, first honor essayist Mary Mitchell will attend Harvard, second honor essayist Sharon Newman will attend either Westbrook or University of New Brunswick and third honor essayist Corey Dionne is finalizing plans to attend the University of Maine at Orono.

As the 1989 summer Reunion approaches, I hope that many of you will be with us. Alumni Director Maria Connors is busy making plans for a very special reunion. My wife Lori and I look forward to seeing you on August 5th.

## Update on Annual Giving

You did it! MCI's alumni and friends have accomplished a remarkable feat this year. The group rose to an unprecedented challenge, met that challenge and surpassed all previous goals for annual giving donations.

From the record amount of \$33,058 raised last year (fiscal year July 1, 1987-June 30, 1988), the loyal supporters of MCI topped this year's goal and raised more than \$63,000.

Student volunteer phonathon caller Aramis Figueroa, a 1989 postgraduate student, made a phone call on the night of April 3rd to Richard Dutting. Mr. Dutting, a longtime friend of MCI, made the pledge that put the 1988-1989 Annual Giving Fund over the \$60,000 mark.

The support you've given will continue to sustain MCI and strengthen the school's commitment to academic excellence.

#### 1924 -

Today is February 19th, the day after the annual winter MCI meeting in Florida. It takes us about two hours to drive to St. Petersburg from Winter Haven, and when we arrived a sizable crowd had gathered. We met **Effie Vroom '25**; she told us that about 85 people were expected. We had a chance to shake hands with Headmaster Cummings and Maria Connors, the Alumni Director: I was glad to see Maria, as she has worked diligently to complete the alumni work.

After enjoying the luncheon, the Headmaster gave a summary of how things were progressing at the school. A pamphlet was handed out, which detailed the plans for the renovation of Founders Hall. Some funds have already been promised, and it is hoped that the Maine Historic Preservation Commission will help further. I expect that a drive will be made and the alumni will be asked for more contributions. The Alumni Director was then asked to speak on behalf of the Alumni Association; she reminded us of the goal that had been set for this year. She thanked us for the funds that had been donated to date.

It was a very enjoyable meeting, and not too long. We were on our way home by 3 o'clock. I was pleased to see **Frank Milan** '18 there. He is 91 years old, the man who makes the chair which is given to a lucky ticket holder at the party. Yesterday's winner was **Darrell Goodridge** '70, who richly deserved the chair, for the many hours he has given to the Alumni Association.

On March 17th, my first letter for the Summer *Alumnus* came from **Hazel Wilson Salsbury**, RFD 1 Box 1140, Lisbon Falls, ME 04252. Over the years, Hazel has been an excellent correspondent; she never needs to be reminded. From what she writes, it's been a good winter in Lisbon Falls, with only one snowstorm and little cold weather to make it uncomfortable. With the approach of some warm weather and bare ground, she's beginning to think about her garden. A relative who lives next door recently had a break in his home, but the thieves were caught and are now serving time (but for how long!). That seems to be the problem. Keep your doors locked and a light on when you leave. Insurance is in order today.

Two letters came in today; they were both happy ones. Flossie Dyer wrote that it had been a good winter, lots of ice, but little snow (who in his 80's wants snow!). She's been traveling again , and in March, enjoyed a trip to Hawaii. Now back in Burnham, it appears that she has spring fever; she went outdoors today to see if any of her flowers are showing their heads. Flossie's expecting her son and his wife back from St. Pete, where they spent the winter.

I was surprised to get a letter from **Connie Adair Cole** in Waterville. Her *Alumnus* also arrived; that was all the encouragement she needed to write a few lines. She was reminded that it will be sixty-five years in June that we graduated from MCI. Connie was a postgraduate; she realizes that the extra year at MCI made her work in college so much easier. Others in her family also graduated from MCI; that tells us why Connie wanted to come to Pittsfield. She doesn't like to drive a distance, but if **Jo Nason** and I promise to attend Homecoming Day August 5th, then she will plan to join us. I promise!

I wrote to the Brewer Convalescent Center the first of April, inquiring about **Grace Wessenger**, who has been confined in this health care center for some time. My letter was referred to Adrian Baillargeon of Milford, ME, Grace's conservator. He mailed me the information I wanted. Grace has been in the nursing home for nine years. Most of the time, she is confined to a wheelchair, but is still able to feed and dress herself without any assistance. She has had several minor strokes causing some memory loss; however, each time, she has recovered fairly well. I sent a letter to Mr. Baillargeon.

They are still staggering in (I mean the letters, not the class agent). I got one today from Goldie Bragdon Bryant, RFD 1, Box 1126, Madison, ME 04950. After the loss of my father, Mother said she was staying in Washington, as this was her home. She had waited up many nights for Father to come home from playing for dances. So, to many people, there is no shutting up a home. Today, there seems to be a challenge to some who notice that there are no steps in and out of a house, and no evidence that anyone is living there. Goldie wrote that she's planning to see us August 5th, and will stay for the banquet. She said she'll bring along Frances. See you there, Goldie.

A letter yesterday from **Jo Nason Ogilvie**, 52 Water St., Howland, ME 04448 just made it. Jo wrote that she has health problems but with the advent of warmer weather, things will be better. Bursitis last summer made it difficult for her to get around. Now it's somewhat better; she's able to get around and get her groceries. For the past two months, she has been fighting a cold; the medicine doesn't seem to be of any help. She is not sure the doctor knows what he's doing and to that I say "Amen." At the moment she's not certain she can make Homecoming, but she'll try. Jo, you'll be a year older next year.

Members of the Class of 1924 will be pleased to know that at Christmastime I received a card from Mary Landry. She is the widow of Wilfred Landry in Warwick, RI. Wilfred was a popular member of this class, who always attended MCI's Reunion. Mary is enjoying good health and wants to be remembered to all of Will's classmates.

This takes care of all the letters I have received for the Summer *Alumnus*. I want to thank you for taking the time to send me something about yourself. You will find it is included in what I have written. No longer will I urge anyone in the Class of 1924 to send me something about yourself. I hope you will keep this class alive by a desire to respond to the Alumni Director's request for information about the Class of 1924. I will mail in any material relating to me. When your work becomes a chore and not a pleasure, it is time to call it a halt.
