Dear Parents and Guardians:

May is a very busy month for our students and school with standardized testing, Prom, and many other extracurricular activities. With regard to exams, Advanced Placement Exams will be administered from May 1 - 12, the SAT exam on May 6, and the Keystone Exams on May 15 - 23. We are implementing a modified Keystone Exam Schedule that is outlined on page 7 of this newsletter. Our Senior Prom will be held on Saturday, May 13 from 7 - 11 PM at SteelStacks in Bethlehem. I highly recommend students also attend Parkland's Post Prom Party at PHS immediately following the Prom. Traditionally, the seniors have enjoyed these events immensely.

Looking ahead to June, just a reminder that PHS will be administering final exams this school year. Final grades will be determined by averaging of the four marking period grades (20 percent each), midterm exam (10 percent), and final exam (10 percent). The last day of scheduled classes for seniors (including LCTI seniors) is Wednesday, May 31. The Class of 2023 Graduation will be held at 7 PM on Tuesday, June 6 at the PPL Center. Graduation practice, which is mandatory for participating seniors, will be held at 8:30 AM at the PPL Center. See pages 10-13 for more information. The last full day of classes for LCTI underclassmen (half day, Academic Center, & CAP) is Tuesday, June 6. The last full day of school for all other underclassmen is Friday, June 9.

Please contact the Counseling Office as soon as possible if your family will be moving within or outside of the Parkland School District.

Two documents are required to confirm a change of residence within the district. In order for new transportation information to be issued on time, the paperwork must be received in the Counseling Office by the end of July.

If moving outside of the district, please contact the Counseling Office to withdraw your child from school. At that time we will provide you with the academic and medical documents necessary to ensure a smooth transition to your new school district.



In May, all eighth-grade middle school students will tour the high school as part of the ninth-grade orientation program. We believe this will help our incoming freshmen ease the anxieties that normally exist with this type of transition.

Please try to complete the lessons in Xello before May 2023. The course will be added and graded for completion during the fourth quarter.

Juniors and Seniors Who Attended Parkland Last Year:

The course was added for you, however you received an unsatisfactory score if it was not completed.

You need to complete this course to graduate.

The Career Explorations program has replaced the Graduation Project requirement for students starting with the Class of 2017. The purpose of this course is to teach students how to match personal needs and expectations with satisfying career options.

In Career Explorations, students will learn:

- * Self-assessment skills
- * To research major and career alternatives
- * To make decisions based upon sound factual information
- * To utilize a variety of resources

Students will need to complete an online course and digital portfolio using tools in Xello. They can access Xello through the Clever App. This work will mostly be done on the student's own time, however students will be introduced to Xello through their physical education classes. Students are free to complete the portfolio at any time on their own. Completion of this course will be determined when all online modules are complete. Upon completion, students will receive a D.5 credit. Course completion does not factor into GPA or class work.

Students can access specifics about the expectations for Career Explorations on "Class of XXXX" course in Schoology. The Schoology page has a screencast to walk the student

through the program and the requirements of the course.

PROJECT VS. TEST

Teachers will have the option of assigning a project-based assessment instead of a traditional test. If a **project** is assigned, it will be completed by all seniors before the exam date. If a **traditional test** is assigned, it will be administered on the exam dates. Teachers will communicate the format of the final exams to their students

EXEMPTIONS

In instances where a class is using a project for the final exam, exemptions will not apply as all will complete the project. Exemptions will only apply in instances where a traditional exam is administered.

EXEMPTION NOTIFICATIONS

Students will be notified of exemptions from traditional testing on or by Tuesday, May 23 for Science and Social Studies Exams and by Thursday, May 25 for Math, English, and World Language Exams.

ADDITIONAL NOTES

- Exam days are FULL DAYS for seniors.
- May 31st, the last day for final exams, is the last day for Seniors (except for those who have makeup exams to take on June 1st)
- If students are exempt from or do not have finals on scheduled exam days, families may report student absence(s) in accordance to our Attendance Policy.

Students will be notified of exemptions from traditional exams on or by Thursday, June 1st for all classes.



ADDITIONAL NOTES

- Students are only required to attend the class period(s) in which they have a traditional exam (if not exempt) provided they have their own transportation.
- If no transportation, students attend their classes following the daily schedule.
- Students who are exempt and/or have projects to complete instead of traditional exams do not need to report on final exam days.
- Friday, June 9th is a makeup day. Students will only report if they have makeup exams to complete.

Pennsylvania Governor's STEM Competition

Congratulations to Parkland High School students Maelina Hontz, Evan Newhard, and Blayne Yocum who presented their Root Rescuer Project for the Pennsylvania Governor's STEM Competition on April 19 and took home second

place out of 75 schools in the original competition. The community; and the students competition asked students to create a device that will benefit and improve the lives of Pennsylvanians. Their focus this year was on the root structure of corn crops since farming relationships with people in the community; and the students interviewed and consulted with two experts in the use of BioChar, which is broken-down charcoal that holds water longer and allows roots to grow stronger when they attach to

is a large part of our state's economy. Pennsylvania primarily has rocky and shallow soil and the state experiences high winds, occasional drought, and flooding due to large rain storms. Part of the competition involved making

relationships with people in the community; and the students experts in the use of BioChar, which is broken-down charcoal that holds water longer and allows roots to grow stronger when they attach to it. The team created a project that would simulate farming equipment planting the seeds. The device uses a seed-dropping mechanism that was 3D printed and coded using VEX robotics to drop one seed at a time, a tube of Biochar that was also coded to drop a small amount, and a pneumatic press that planted the corn and Biochar into the ground.
