IMPORTANT INFORMATION

On November 2nd, 2021, STMA residents will be asked to consider an operating levy to maintain our tradition of excellence. As your principal, it is my job to provide information to families. It is important for you to be informed with factual information to see how the levy may impact your child. Please read through the following information, as I know student learning, class sizes, activities and the way in which we deliver instruction may be greatly impacted depending upon the outcome of the levy vote.

- **Class Sizes**

In a typical year, class size targets in grades K - 4 = 20-26. THIS YEAR, class sizes range from 26-36 in grades K-4. If an operating levy is not passed, an additional 60-70 staff will need to be cut and class sizes will increase dramatically. Absent additional dollars such as a levy, class sizes are estimated to be 35-45 in grades K-8.

STRONG SCHOOLS = STRONG COMMUNITIES

On **November 2, 2021**, STMA residents will be asked to maintain our tradition of excellence by voting on a modest levy.

Low state funding, pandemic-related costs, and stabilizing enrollment have wreaked havoc on the district's bottom line. Without a sustainable source of local revenue, STMA will likely face a significant decrease in the quality and quantity of student programming, larger class sizes, more staff reductions, and fewer activity opportunities for students.

APPROVAL MAINTAINS ESSENTIALS

This levy would fund essential functions throughout the district such as teachers and support staff. Approval of a levy would allow us to hire staff back and return class sizes to previous levels. We are only asking for what we need to avoid the following:

- Increased class sizes [cuts of 60-70 additional staff]
- Elimination of programs [art, music, high-potential/advanced]
- Elimination of middle school activities and lower-level high school activities
- Increases in walking distances to school

PAST STMA ELECTIONS

STMA has only brought forward 2 voting issues in the last 10 years.

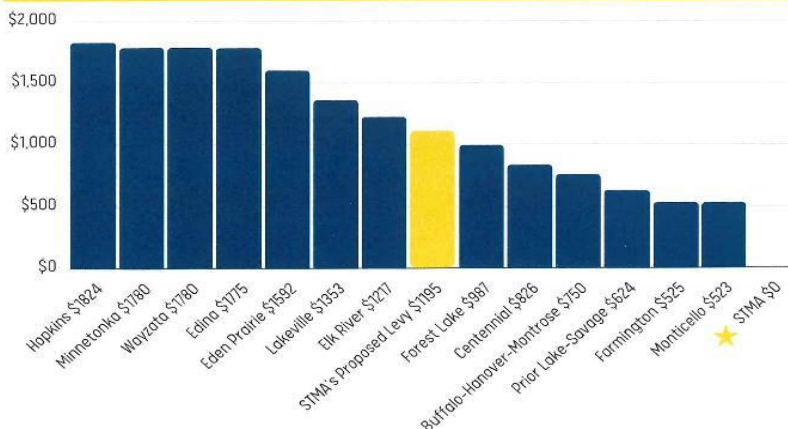
2011: STMA voters approved a levy. However, due to legislation changes in 2015, the levy dollars were rolled into Local Optional Revenue. This essentially eliminated the additional per pupil funding we were receiving.

2017: STMA voters graciously approved a bond. Bond referenda are for buildings and levy referenda are for learning or paying for operating costs such as staff salaries. The 2017 school election was a bond referendum as the dollars were used for buildings, not operations.

TAX IMPACT: \$1195 PER STUDENT = \$59/MONTH*

RESIDENT FUNDING COMPARED TO SIMILAR DISTRICTS



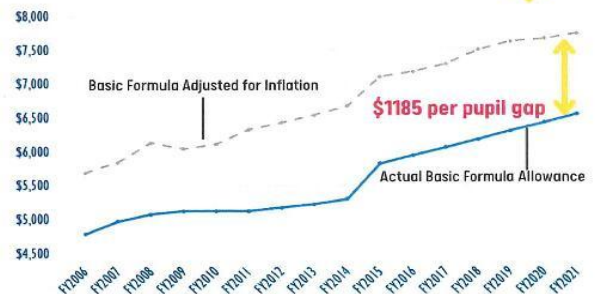
DID YOU KNOW?

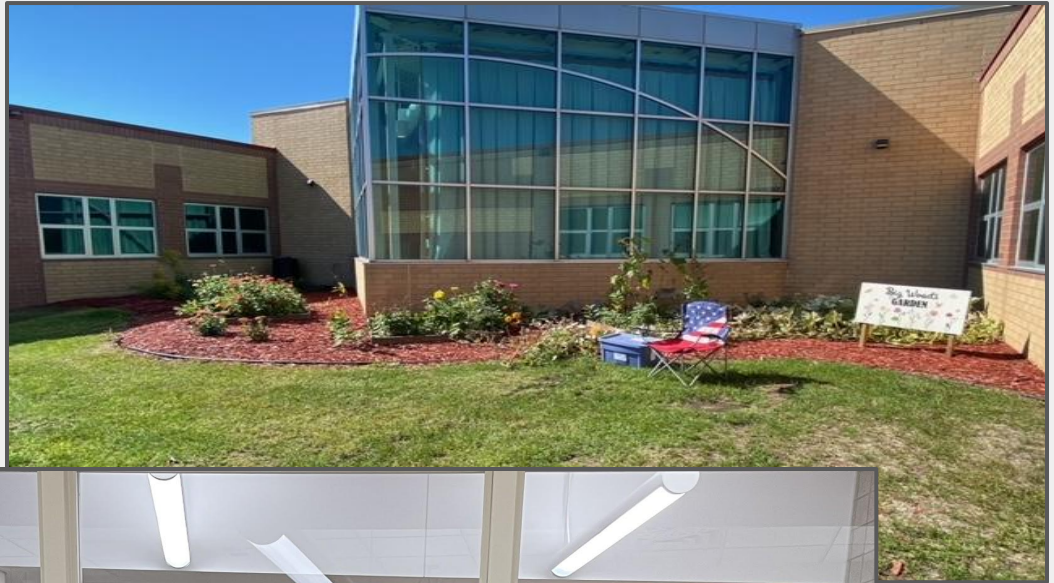

Attendance Procedures

Please call Big Woods 24-hour attendance line number 763-497-8025, Ext. 1 if your child will be absent due to an emergency, illness or any other reason. If you know your child is going to be absent for an extended period of time, please call the attendance line in advance. It is extremely important to contact school before 7:45 AM each day your child is absent. If we don't receive a call from you by the end of the school day, the absence will be considered "unexcused". If a student has excessive absences, we will contact you in order to both inform and offer assistance in improving your child's attendance. State law requires all school age children must attend school every day that school is in session and our district attendance policy provides us with truancy guidelines and procedures. Thank you in advance for your diligence regarding your child's school attendance.
