



Todd Koehler presented to 8th grade social studies students his collection of Native American artifacts which are currently on display in the middle school. Todd has been excavating arrowheads for over 30 years. He said most are not actually arrowheads, used for a bow, but are actually tools such as knives. There are tomahawks on display. Todd found one site where there were over 300 arrowheads in one general area. He encouraged students to search for arrowheads near water, but warned them not to dig on public gameland.
