1. How will the LEA, to the greatest extent practicable, support prevention and mitigation policies in line with the most up-to-date guidance from the CDC for the reopening and operation of school facilities in order to continuously and safely open and operate schools for in-person learning?

The District will review guidelines and recommendations from the CDC, PA Department of Health, local health officials and PDE in an effort to safely open our schools for in-person learning. The goal is to keep transmission as low as possible to safely continue school activities. The Lehigh Area School District was able to safely provide in-person learning for grades Pre K-8 for the 2020-2021 school year. The mitigation strategies will continue to be part of the 2021-2022 Health and Safety Plan listed below. Our goal, again for this school year, will be to maximize the amount of in-person learning for all students throughout the District. This plan was developed in consultation with staff and local health officials to meet the unique needs of the Lehigh Area School District. The plan may be revised and updated as federal, state and local health data is received throughout the school year.

2. How will the LEA ensure continuity of services, including but not limited to services to address the students' academic needs, and students' and staff members' social, emotional, mental health, and other needs, which may include student health and food services?

The Lehigh Area School District was able to operate summer programs in a safe and healthy environment to address learning loss for students in grades K-8 due to the impact of COVID-19. The students who participated were provided meals through our

Seamless Summer Option Program. Professional and Support Staff offered educational opportunities for students during the summer months. In addition, the Lehigh Area School District conducted summer Title I Reading and Math Programs for students who qualified. Our School Counselors and Nurses were available as a resource during the above listed programs.

The District will continue to offer support throughout the upcoming 2021-2022 school year. The supports include, but are not limited to, the following:

- a. Multi-Tiered System of Support (MTSS)
- b. Remediation and recovery programs to combat COVID-19 associated learning loss
- c. School Counselors and Social Workers
- d. School Psychologists
- e. Behavior Interventionists
- f. Third Party Health and Safety Providers

3. 2021-2022 Athletics Procedures

LASD Athletics will follow the guidelines/procedures as recommended from our current health/athletic provider (Lehigh Valley Health Network).

4. Transportation 2021-2022

Lehigh Area School District will physically distance students on buses, when possible. Students living in the same household will be required to sit together when being transported to and from School. If feasible, bus windows will be open to improve ventilation. All students will be required to wear a mask on a school bus.

A. Universal and correct wearing of <u>masks</u>;	Employees and students will comply with CDC/PA Department of Health (DOH) masking guidance/requirements. At this time, masks will be required by all staff and students in-doors during the school day and during classroom-related activities prior or after school such as remediation or tutoring. Students will not be required to wear masks in school related outdoor activities. Local & State data will be reevaluated on a monthly basis to determine universal masking requirements.
B. Modifying facilities to allow for <u>physical distancing</u> (e.g., use of cohorts/podding);	Lehigh Area School District will implement physical distancing strategies, modified classroom layouts, desk spacing, use of multiple entrances/exits, locker usage will be permitted, removal of non-essential classroom furniture to the greatest

	<p>extent feasible. Students and employees will be encouraged to maintain physical distance to the maximum extent feasible and appropriate when eating and drinking. To the greatest extent possible, instruction and activities will occur outside weather permitting.</p>
<p>C. <u>Handwashing and respiratory etiquette</u>;</p>	<p>Lehigh Area School District employees will be/have been trained on proper handwashing and respiratory etiquette. Teachers will teach and reinforce proper handwashing and respiratory etiquette to their students. Additionally, the District will ensure access to adequate supplies including soap and hand sanitizer. Posting of visual signs in high-traffic locations that promote good hygiene.</p>
<p>D. <u>Cleaning</u> and maintaining healthy facilities, including improving <u>ventilation</u>;</p>	<p>Lehigh Area School District will follow standard practices and appropriate regulations for cleaning and disinfection. Cleaning, sanitizing, and disinfecting will be performed in accordance with current CDC and PA DOH recommendations/guidelines. Additionally, EPA approved products will be used in accordance with labeling requirements. Furthermore, the District will routinely clean high-touch surfaces and objects. District will occasionally place Halo Machines in classrooms and other areas throughout the buildings for additional cleaning purposes. HVAC system/equipment and monitoring will continue to be maintained by our service provider.</p>
<p>E. <u>Contact tracing</u> in combination with <u>isolation</u> and <u>quarantine</u>, in collaboration with the State and local health departments;</p>	<p>Lehigh Area School District will continue to notify the PA DOH immediately upon learning that a person with a confirmed (or probable) case of COVID-19, is present at the school or a school event while infectious. The District will work collaboratively with the PA DOH staff on matters related to risk assessment, isolation and quarantine recommendations, and other infection control recommendations.</p>
<p>F. <u>Diagnostic</u> and screening testing;</p>	<p>School nurses will advise students, teachers, and staff to stay home if they are sick or if they have been exposed to COVID-19. Additionally, school nurses will encourage these individuals to talk to their healthcare provider about getting a COVID-19 test. All parents/guardians should still closely monitor their children and keep them home if symptomatic. All employees should still closely monitor their symptoms and remain home if symptomatic. Parents and guardians of students are required to report positive diagnosis of COVID-19 to their child's school nurse. If any LASD student or community member</p>

G. Efforts to provide <u>vaccinations to school communities</u>;	<p>Lehigh Area School District has facilitated employee vaccination efforts with our local health facilities and IU. Lehigh Area School District will continue to work collaboratively with local vaccination providers to share vaccination clinic information and to offer vaccination clinic space, when needed. A community vaccination clinic was held on August 12, 2021 and second doses are scheduled to be administered on September 2, 2021. Another vaccination clinic is scheduled in October 2021.</p>


