Spring Dress Code Reminders

As warmer weather approaches, here are just a few reminders about appropriate attire while keeping modesty in mind. The NCS Parent-Student Handbook covers dress code specifics, but here are the dress code expectations in a nutshell.

Shorts

No shorts allowed on liturgy days

Use same guidelines as pants (no sweats, wind or athletic shorts)

No shorter than 3 inches above the kneecap – Please keep modesty in mind and use your best judgment

Shirts and Dresses

No tank tops – unless it is under a dress code compliant shirt or top

Dresses having a tank top or little narrow straps are not allowed unless it is covered by a dress code compliant shirt or top

Footwear

No flip flops, swimming type of shoes or other footwear styles that are considered beachwear

Heel straps on open backed shoes are required for elementary students for safety

4K

Spring is here! In 4K, that means it is time to celebrate all the new growth happening in the world around us, and in your children! Both 4K classes have been working very hard, and it is exciting to see how far each of your children have come over the course of the school year.

Some of the themes we have focused on this spring have been eggs/nests and baby animals, weather, Earth Day and recycling, and seeds and plants. As we work our way through May, we will be learning about insects, the life cycles of plants, butterflies, and frogs, and various animal habitats such as the pond, zoo, ocean, and farm.

In math, we have introduced three dimensional shapes and counting on. We will continue to build on, and practice, both. We will also be learning how to use multiples of the same unit to measure and work on extending and creating patterns.

We will be using our science skill of observation to look for signs of spring, watch the bean seeds we planted sprout, and see our classroom caterpillars transform into butterflies!

Each week we continue to improve upon naming and recognizing our alphabet letters and their sounds, printing our letters, rhyming words, and locating syllables in words. This is the time of the year in which students make an amazing discovery. As we continue to work on spelling and reading simple CVC words, as well as write words and journal, your children discover they are readers and writers! It is truly a joy to witness! Please continue to foster their excitement for literacy at home.

First Grade News

The children are becoming excellent readers! I am amazed at the wonderful reading skills the children are developing. They are reading with confidence and enthusiasm.

We continue to review money skills in math. Please encourage your child to count pennies, nickels, dimes and quarters at home. We are studying fractions and probability in our new unit. Our social studies units focus on map reading skills. We have learned how to use maps to analyze the spatial organization of people, places, and environments. We will be looking at specific maps of some states and studying their physical characteristics.

We are learning about the parts of the mass in religion class and deepening our understanding of how Catholic Christians act like Jesus. We give special honor to our mother Mary in the month of May.

Please continue to check the weekly newsletter that your child brings home every Monday. It will give you specific information about what we are learning each week and how you can reinforce these skills at home. 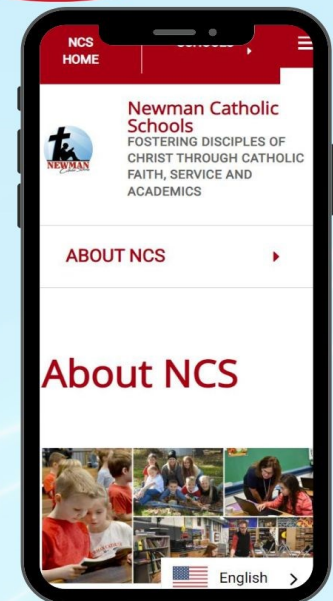

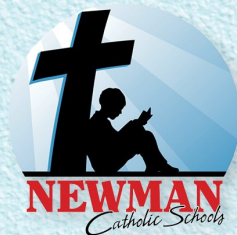
