

Girls Who Code Constitution

Article One: Purpose of the Club

- To educate, equip, and inspire girls with the computing skills they'll need to pursue 21st century opportunities.
- To close the gender gap in technology by allowing girls to explore coding in a fun, friendly environment

Article Two: Club Officers

- Article 2A: Club officer positions will only run for the school year and will be re-elected annually.

Article Three: Duties of the Officers

- Article 3A: The duties and responsibilities of the **president** will be to coordinate meetings, assign roles and tasks, and communicate with the higher officials.
- Article 3B: The duties and responsibilities of the **vice president** includes sharing responsibilities and communicating with the president and other members.
- Article 3C: The duties and responsibilities of the **secretary** is to help organize meetings, take notes and maintain records of all meetings and decisions.
- Article 3D: The duties and responsibilities of the **treasurer** are to keep track of new and existing funds, as well as calculating profit and expenses from fundraisers.
- Article 3E: The duties and responsibilities of the **publicist** are to encourage more participation in the club and promote our club while keeping track of incoming members. The publicist will also manage the club's official instagram handle, and post regularly and/or before major events to keep members updated.
- Article 3F: The duties and responsibilities of the **fundraiser** are to raise funds and gather donations for the club, and create promotional materials when needed.

Article Four: Qualifications for Membership

- Article 4A: Any Wilcox student who identifies as a female and is passionate about coding or seeks to learn to code is eligible for membership.

- Article 4B: The student shall participate by attending meetings and activities, fundraising, and contributing ideas to the club.
- Article 4C: No prior coding experience is necessary.

Article 5: Dues

Article 5A: No entrance fee is required to be a member of Girls Who Code.

Article 6: Meetings

Article 6A: Meetings will be scheduled by the club president and be approved by the club officers. Meetings will usually be held every week on Wednesday for one hour after school.

Article 7: Amendments to the Constitution

Article 7A: An amendment may be passed if it is turned in to the club president and the club advisor and officers vote on the amendment. If majority rules, the amendment will be added to the constitution.
