From the SIC

The SIC meets each month to present and discuss a variety of initiatives to enrich the lives of our students, based on needs identified in the strategic renewal plan. The two focus areas for the committee this year were assisting the new principal through a year of dynamic school transformation and establishing a highly effective SIC through new bylaws, collaboration, and protocols to assist WBECHS in meeting all goals.



Although our school has been the recipient of the MedTech7 grant for two years; WBECHS will need to complete the STEM certification

process and_have all teachers trained in STEAM to ensure cohesive implementation of curriculum to students. This certification as a STEAM school is highly important as the MedTech 7 grant provides funding for teacher positions, instructional materials, and training to ensure the students of Whale Branch have access to high quality STEAM instruction. WBECHS's funding has a cybersecurity/IT focus where our students are receiving instruction and hands-on learning that can earn them a certification for IT jobs after high school.

The SIC provided advice and support to Ms. Coleman regarding the addition of interventionists for the school. When looking in the budget, the SIC saw the need for an interventionist to assist in closing gaps for students can achieve on standardized testing.

School Sponsored Activities & Programs

- WBECHS Wellness Initiative- The wellness committee organized many activities and initiatives including a staff weight-loss challenge, a new garden to be run by students, and reusable WBECHS water bottles distributed to all students.
- The HOSA Club had the most successful on campus blood drive since the pandemic. 22 donations were made that could save 60 lives in Beaufort County.
- All WBECHS students attended a Career Fair where they received information from 33 vendors. Students got to network with future employers and learn about position requirements.
- WBECHS Theater students served as actors in a safety demonstration and presentation regarding drunk and reckless driving for the Prom Promise. State Troopers and the Burton Fire Dept made a presentation to all Juniors and Seniors after the accident simulation.
- Afterschool Tutoring and EOC Bootcamp kicked off this semester Monday through Thursday including transportation, an afternoon snack, and quality instruction.
- Community Service Initiatives were completed throughout the year including Principals Ambassadors participating in district feedback focus groups, Community Cleanups with National Honor Society, and produce drive-thru food distributions.
- Arts Showcase Night returned to our school in the spring with the Band, Theater, and Dance performing accompanied by a Warrior art display.
- Scholarship Application Day and HBCU Day continued to educate and engage students in postsecondary dialogue. Students were able to receive information in addition to having hands-on assistance with applications.
