What is Baldwin Family Village?

Baldwin Family Village will be the first of its kind in Baldwin County, Alabama.

The 13-unit facility will provide transitional housing and support services for women and children experiencing homelessness. The Baldwin Family Village will operate as a program of the Dumas Wesley Community Center and is slated to open in April, 2023.

The Dumas Wesley Community Center has been operating the Sybil Smith Family Village transitional housing program in Mobile since 1999. The Sybil Smith Family Village boasts an 88% success rate among residents moving into permanent housing. This statistic is 17% higher than the national average, according to HUD. Dumas Wesley will replicate the Sybil Smith Family Village model at the Baldwin Family Village, which is expected to house approximately 100 homeless women children annually. What is Neighborhood Bridges?

The mission: To bridge communities and schools by providing basic needs, removing barriers, and seeking equity for students so they can engage and succeed in school and life. Neighborhood Bridges is a 501(c)(3) charitable organization that utilizes social media and technology to meet the needs of K-12 students in Baldwin County. Advocates are enlisted in area schools and those advocates help share the needs of students within their schools. Needs are anonymous and shared with the community through social media in order to be met by members of the community in a timely manner.
