OPEN HOUSE

TO: ALL HIGH SCHOOL PARENTS

The High School will be having our open house on Monday August 20th.

STUDENT PARKING

A change in vehicle during the year will require the student to update the information in the office.

Students can enter the back doors in the morning but the back doors will be closed at 8:30 and remain closed during the day for security purposes.

- Name and grade of the student.
- Date of absence and possible return.
- Reason for absence.
- Person calling.
- Phone number where the parent/guardian can be reached.

An absence is excused for the following reasons:

- Personal Illness
- Illness in a family
- Death of a relative
- Emergencies due to the absence of a parent or guardians.
- Religious holiday.
- Other special circumstances that can be seen in the handbook.
