Extended Day Learning Option Offered During 4th Grading Quarter

To coincide with the start of the fourth grading quarter on Monday, April 12th, the District will be offering an Extended Day Learning Option for select students from 1:30 – 2:30 pm for specified gradelevels and content areas. This initiative is being launched to address the specific enrichment and remediation learning needs that have occurred during the ongoing pandemic. Parents will receive building specific schedules and details from principals in the next week.

Exciting Opportunities for Our Students

The Brooklyn City Schools are proud to offer several new educational and enrichment opportunities for our students. The newly launched Brooklyn Digital Learning Academy (BDLA) is a hybrid learning option for students in grades 10-12, and 9th graders with permission from the building principal, who need an alternative to the traditional in-person school day, or who are better served working at their own pace. The BDLA is currently enrolling and interested parents can find more information on page three of this latest edition of the Hurricane Watch newsletter.

Through a partnership with Brooklyn Recreation Department and Saint Thomas More School, students entering grades K-6 at the start of the 2021-2022 school year will have the opportunity to attend a Summer Day Camp beginning in June 2021. District Launches Brooklyn Digital Learning Academy

The Brooklyn City Schools is excited to announce the launch of the Brooklyn Digital Learning Academy (BDLA), an innovative hybrid learning option featuring both in-person and remote learning formats. Instruction will be delivered by certified Brooklyn City Schools educators and staff using the same curriculum offered to students in a traditional classroom setting. Students will have the opportunity to learn at their own pace with flexible schedule options in a physically safe environment. The BDLA is open to all District students entering grades 10-12 for the 2021-22 school year, with options available for 9th graders receiving permission from the building principal. Interested families are asked to make a commitment to the BDLA for a full semester and submit their online application to the High School principal no later than April 15, 2021. BHS Art Teacher Chris Kaspar Honored with Photograph Accepted into **International Juried Exhibition**

Congratulations to Brooklyn High School Art teacher Mr. Chris Kaspar who was recently given the honor of having a photograph submission selected for display in the 2020: International Juried Photography Exhibition hosted by The University of Southern Mississippi Museum of Art and School of Performing and Visual Arts. The online exhibition took place in February 2021 and featured photographs submitted by individuals from across the globe which conveyed each artist's personal perspective on living through the unprecedented year of 2020. Mr. Kaspar's submission, "A Happy Family", was created using a combination of analog photography and technology to create a new image that was printed on large-scale metal plates. For A "Happy Family" and similar bodies of work, Mr. Kaspar first identifies photographs taken from around the world and dating from the late 19th century to the 1970's.

"I search for photographs that speak to me on an aesthetic level or I find an image from the past that seems relevant to current political and social issues," shares Mr. Kaspar. After scanning the photograph, Mr. Kaspar applies a manipulation to the scan resulting in a new image.

Brooklyn School Celebrates Right to Read Week

To help promote the importance of literacy, Brooklyn School hosts a variety of fun readingcentered events throughout the school year, including the much-anticipated annual Right to Read Week celebration. This year's observance took place during the Week of March 8th - 12th, and included Guest Reader Day on Tuesday, March 9th. District staff, community leaders, public safety workers, and others visited K-7 classrooms, virtually and in-person, to read and discuss a selected book with students. The list of quest readers included Superintendent Dr. Theodore Caleris, City of Brooklyn Mayor Katie Gallagher, Brooklyn Council Pro-Tem Andy Celcherts, representatives from the Brooklyn Fire Department, including Fire Chief Kevin Paul, and members of the City of Brooklyn Police Department, including Police Chief Scott Mielke.

Several classrooms also had the opportunity to go to the playground area and meet members of the Southwest Enforcement Bureau's Crisis Negotiations Team, including Brooklyn Police Lieutenant Cindy Eschweiler, and listen to a story inside the unit's Mobile Command Center. A fun time was had by everyone who participated. In addition to Guest Reader Day, each grade level participated in a variety of different activities to celebrate Right to Read Week. Some grade levels featured specific themes, such as First grade, which incorporated an "Enchanted Forest" theme through mystical stories, a homemade puppet activity, and more. Special thanks to first grade teacher Lisa Foley for helping to coordinate guest reader appearances. Finally, thank you to all guest readers for spending time with our students and promoting the importance of literacy.

5th Grade Science Students Construct Terrariums During Engaging Lab Activity

Fifth grade students at Brooklyn School had the opportunity to conduct research, develop a hypothesis, test it with experimentation and share results as part of an interactive lab activity in science class. Students constructed actual terrariums in which grass seed would be planted and observed over a period of time. The project called for students to use gravel, charcoal, landscaping fabric, soil seeds and water to sow grass seeds. Along the way, they made predictions about when the seeds would sprout and how long will it take for them to grow to certain heights. Students analyzed the important processes of condensation formation, which is part of photosynthesis. Once grass reached a height of 5 cm, each group changed a variable of growth, such as amount of light, the amount of water, soil conditions and heat levels. Once all data was collected, students delivered a presentation on their findings. This science experience allowed students to walk through steps of the scientific method, enhanced their grasp of photosynthesis and deploy creativity. Way to go 5th grade science students!
