Dear Brooklyn City Schools Community,

The 2020-2021 school year has presented unprecedented challenges for our students, staff, and families due to the ongoing pandemic. Thanks to the determination, patience, and support demonstrated by our entire Hurricane Family, the Brooklyn City Schools have successfully made the necessary transitions to keep our students learning and engaged. After beginning the year remotely

on September 8th, the District made the decision to resume in-person learning on September 28th in our 4-day Hybrid Learning Format. In response to a recommendation from the Cuyahoga County Board of Health (CCBOH) and other county elected officials based on the rapid increase in COVID-19 cases, all students in grades PK-12 shifted to Remote Learning beginning on November 30th through December 18th, which is the last day of classes before winter break. School will resume during the Week of January 4th, and the District will decide on the appropriate learning mode based on the county health advisory system designation and CCBOH recommendations. The District will continue to rely upon a strong partnership with our families to make the best decisions with the information available and help our students and staff to remain successful and safe.

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District Achieves Successful Return to In-Person Learning

After beginning the year remotely, Brooklyn teachers and staff welcomed back PK-12 students to the District for in-person learning as part of the Hybrid Model on Monday, September 28, 2020. As outlined in the District's Reopening Plan, ensuring the health and well-being of students, staff, and the community is the number one priority of the Brooklyn City Schools. All students and staff wore required face coverings, maintained appropriate social distancing, and followed other important health and safety measures. In the Hybrid Format, PK-12 students receive daily in-person learning on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday of each week. On Wednesdays, Preschool students have no school, while PK-12 students engage in remote learning from home. Students enrolled in the remote model continue to receive instruction online. While the return to school looked different than past years, a sense of excitement and 'Hurricane Pride' was evident throughout the entire Brooklyn campus. With the shift to Remote Learning on November 30th, the district will decide on the appropriate learning model based on the county health advisory system designation and CCBOH recommendations, when school resumes on January 4th. Thank you to our families for their continued patience and understanding.

4th Graders Visit Stickney Creek



4th grade students enjoyed seasonably warm weather and a variety of hands-on activities during a recent field trip to Stickney Creek

4th grade students took advantage of the seasonably warm weather on Wednesday, October 14th with a field trip to explore Stickney Creek at Veteran's Memorial Park. The outdoor learning activity was organized by 4th grade teacher Lisa Kubinksi and included four different stations aligned with grade level Science and Social Studies standards. For the Stream Monitoring station, students explored various creek features at work such as evidence of erosion, deposition, water quality, and physical characteristics, as well as pH level measurements. Students also examined the health of the natural habitat by catching and observing macroinvertebrates, which are organisms without backbones. For the Animal Habitat Hunt station, students searched for various examples of animal habitats in the area surrounding Stickney Creek.

The two remaining stations aligned with Social Studies standards, and included Cardinal Directions, where students studied and learned how to navigate using the four main compass points, and Landform Models, through which students created models of various landforms. Brooklyn's 4th graders greatly enjoyed the opportunity to engage in hands-on learning activities and explore the world around them.

Brooklyn Students Celebrate School Spirit

Many classrooms also celebrated with a variety of related games and activities. The Brooklyn City Schools Board of Education officially named Mrs. Colleen Aholt as the District's new Interim Treasurer in June 2020. Mrs. Aholt comes to Brooklyn after having served in the position of Assistant Treasurer at Polaris Career Center for over six years. She holds a bachelor's degree in Accounting and a Master's Degree in Business from Cleveland State University and recently renewed her treasurer's license for the next five years. Mrs. Aholt began her career in 2007 at the Ohio Auditor of State's office where she was responsible for preparing various financial reports for local school districts, cities, and counties. As District Treasurer, Mrs. Aholt is responsible for overseeing all fiscal operations of the school district, including preparation of annual financial budgets, forecasts and reports, payroll, accounting, and management of District inventory. Mrs. Aholt greatly appreciates the community of the Brooklyn City Schools and seeks to demonstrate fiscal

Brooklyn City Schools Remain Financially Stable Despite Financial Challenges Related to COVID-19

The ongoing COVID-19 pandemic has caused significant financial challenges for both public and private entities across Ohio and the nation, including the Brooklyn City Schools. In Fiscal Year 2020, the State of Ohio cut approximately \$216,174 from the District's Foundation payments. The District received approximately \$994, 439.33 in various grant monies in Fiscal Year 2020 to supplement state and local funds expended for educational purposes. The Brooklyn City Schools also received \$460,100 in COVID-19 related funds in Fiscal Year 2021 for providing coordination of preparedness and response efforts, training, and professional development of staff, planning and coordinating during the long-term closure, and purchasing technology for students. In spite of the aforementioned challenges, the District remains financially stable and has a positive five-year financial forecast. The District is extremely grateful for the continued support of the Brooklyn community, including the passage of new operating funds in May 2019 and two renewal levies in November 2019 and April 2020, respectively.
