

- 9 Vocational/Trade Programs offered at Polaris Career Center for students in grades 11-12 in Automotive Technology, Culinary Arts, Construction Trades, Cosmetology, Criminal Justice, Dental Assisting, Medical Technician/Fire Training, Welding Technologies, and Precision CNC Machining
- © College Credit Plus Program provides students the ability to earn college credit while taking classes on our high school campus. We offer courses in College Algebra, College Composition I and II and Public Speaking, Introduction to Literacy, Introduction to Fiction
- Brooklyn High School graduates each earned 20 hours of community service
- High School course credit offered for 8th graders in Algebra I and Foreign Language
- World Languages offered include Spanish and Chinese with AP programs available for both Spanish Language and Chinese Language and Culture
- 4-Star Pre-Kindergarten Program that delivers a high-quality education in an early learning environment specifically designed for our youngest students
- Multiple field trips and overnight class trips that enrich and engage students in grades K-12 outside of the classroom


- Newly developed program to ensure post-secondary success for graduating seniors

- An innovative hybrid learning option featuring both in-person and remote learning formats, the Brooklyn Digital Learning Academy provides students in grades 10-12 and those possessing grade level learning aptitudes, the District's engaging curriculum and programming opportunities while meeting their unique learning needs
- Project Lead the Way (PLTW) programs are offered in Medical Detectives, Robotics, Design and Modeling, Introduction to Engineering Design, Principles of Engineering, Digital Electronics and Computer Science and Engineering

FACILITIES AND OPERATIONS


- Mew facility built in 2015 holds approximately 750 students in grades PK-7
- Resurfacing of all district parking lots

- Track Resurfacing Project completed in the fall of 2022
- Turf Field was installed at Brooklyn Memorial Stadium in 2015 and funded by the passage of a bond issue
- High School was built in 1957
- Facility Study conducted in the fall of 2022 to determine the future infrastructure needs in the district
- Furniture replacement throughout the high school and PK-7 campus
- New carpet installed throughout the campus
- Upgrades to fire, safety and security systems throughout the district campus
- New roofs on High School being completed in phases. Began in 2018 and is ongoing
- Purchased 3 new buses
- Addition of Preschool playground turf during the summer of 2023




FINANCES


The Brooklyn City Schools place a high priority on financial responsibility and transparency.
