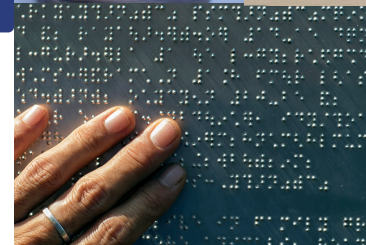

Services and Placement Options for Students Identified as Deaf, Hard of Hearing, or Deafblind



Woodburn School District Services

The Woodburn School District has a collaborative partnership with Willamette Education Service District (WESD) to provide a comprehensive service model for students who are deaf, hard of hearing, or deafblind. All regional services can be delivered within the school district's schools and programs.

It is our mission to engage, inspire, and prepare all students to learn, lead, and contribute toward a just community, both local and global. We value partnerships with WESD, parents, students, and other community partners to ensure all students in our community receive the services to best meet their needs. Placement Options

There is a continuum of placement options available for students with disabilities. Most options are within the Woodburn School District; however, there are regional options as well. The IEP team will consider all possible placements that are appropriate for the student. The IEP team must consider the Least Restrictive Environment. Below are possible placement options that may be considered. Please contact case manager or Student Services for additional information.

Woodburn School District

There is a continuum of options within the Woodburn School District that may include: general education with special education services provided inside or outside the classroom; special education settings of Learning Center, Intensive Learning Center, and Functional Intensive Learning Centers.

Center Sites for Deaf/Hard of Hearing in Salem Keizer School District

Willamette Education Service District regional programs also include specific schools within the Salem Keizer School District that focus on Deaf/Hard of Hearing services for students in smaller districts within the region. There is a focus on sign language development and increased access to deaf and hard of hearing peers within a general education setting.

If this option is selected as best meeting the student's needs, the school district will provide daily transportation at no cost to the family. The student will continue to be eligible to participate in extracurricular activities in local neighborhood school in Woodburn.

Oregon School for the Deaf

Oregon School for the Deaf (OSD) is also located in Salem and is available to students who are deaf or hard of hearing. There is a strong deaf community with deaf adult role models and deaf peer group. Instruction is provided in American Sign Language (ASL) at all times.

The school offers both day school and residential school options. If OSD is selected as best meeting the student's needs, the school district will provide transportation at no cost to the family.

The student continues to be eligible to participate in extracurricular activities in the local neighborhood school in Woodburn.
