### Director's Note

'Alice in Wonderland and Through the Looking Glass' might seem a strange choice for an all-boys school - the main character is a girl surely!? Well, that's certainly what Lewis Carroll thought - his infatuation with the original Alice (Liddell) is wellknown and, perhaps, best not considered in too much detail, innocuous though this infatuation almost certainly was. In light of this, having made the perverse decision to choose 'Alice' as the First Form Play, how was I to deal with the eponymous heroine? Dressing up a young boy as a girl was anathema to me – although young boys are often keener than might be supposed to don a crinoline and cami-knickers - but I hope you will find my alternative solution acceptable. Suffice it to say that Alice, in this production, is very definitely a boy, and after all, youthful imagination is not the sole preserve of the female, nor is the loss of innocence that is the inevitable fate of visitors to Wonderland, and the realm beyond the Looking Glass.
