

U13 National Netball Finals

A bronze medal at the U13 National Netball Finals for the U13 girls.

After the original U13 Small School National Netball Finals were postponed back in March for bad weather the U13 team finally got to play in their IAPS competition on Friday.

Yateley Manor were in Pool A and after a nervous but successful first game against Beachborough School, the team settled into their normal confident play and easily won their next game against West Hill Park. We then came up against a very strong St Christopher team and although we played well the opposition were strong and the shooters very accurate, it was our first defeat of the day. The next game against St Neots was quite literally a game of two halves. St Neots had the upper hand in the first half, but we held on to keep the score 2 - 2. In the second half we surged ahead taking control of the game winning 6 - 2. Our last game against Hatherop Castle gave us another win meaning that we came second in the cup competition and faced Ashfold in the semi-finals.

It was a well matched semi-final, the team started the game nervously and went behind 4 - 0 quite quickly. The girls then steadied themselves to get a few goals back, but Ashfold proved just too composed on this occasion winning 8 - 4.

We had one more game to play, for the Bronze medal against Barnardiston Hall Prep and teh team were determined to go home with a medal. They played an excellent game and were fully in control winning 8 - 4.

This is the highest ever finishing position for a Netball team from Yateley Manor at the National Finals, huge congratulations to team - Kayleigh H, Michelle A, Annabelle S, Matilda U, Evie N, Ella W, Victoria H and Georgia M, with a special mention to Abigail S in Y6 who played up 2 years.

INAMOS - In A Manor Of Speaking

Year 7

Year 7 have been learning to code a Micro:bit, which is a programmable pocket sized computer with inputs and outputs. So as part of our STEM work, children in Year 7 have learnt that the Micro:bit can be coded to detect a circuit and how the circuit can include fruit and themselves! Children learnt that the water (and citric acids) in fruit and also with human bodies containing ions can conduct electricity. Children learnt that the code would need "conditions" nestled in a forever loop (Iteration), i.e. IF the circuit is complete THEN display an icon or play a tune, ELSE remain off. Once Micro:bits were programmed and the basic circuits formed, the challenge was then on to see how many pieces of fruit and children could form a circuit; the boys in set 1 were very successful at collaboratively coming together to form circuits with lots of fruit and linking themselves together. Sasha and Evelyn also formed their own circuits finding as many different objects as possible that conducted electricity to see if their Micro:bit would still come to life!
