## **Woodruff High School**

Dr. Aaron Fulmer reported the following:

- Advance Placement Exams were administered in Calculus, Statistics, U.S. History, Government, English Language, English Literature, Environmental Science, Chemistry, Biology, Computer Science and Studio Art.
- 2. End of course tests were administered in Algebra I, English II, U.S. History and Biology from May 5 through May 19.
- 3. Award's Day was held on May 21. Medals were given in all academic areas as well as other designated areas voted upon by faculty, staff, and students. The ceremony was well attended by parents.
- 4. The 2021-2022 Woodruff Student Council elections are complete. The Student Body officers are: President-Coco Zheng, Vice President-Allie Green, Secretary-Emily Thompson and Treasurer-Jennifer Delgado.
- 5. Senior Exams were May 24, 25 and 26. Underclassmen exams were held on May 26, 27 and 28. Graduation was held May 28, 2021 in the WHS Gymnasium.

## **Instructional Reports**

Dr. Kim McAbee reported the following:

- 1. District Four's Expanded ADEPT Implementation Plan has been submitted to the SCDE. The plan outlines the district's methods for evaluating educators at the various contract levels (induction, annual, and continuing). In addition, it includes the district's evaluation timeline and plans for supporting the Student Learning Objective (SLO) process.
- 2. Beginning in 2021-22, speech-language pathologists, school counselors, and school librarians will be evaluated under the Expanded ADEPT system based on rubrics specific to their specialty areas. The evaluation for speech-language pathologists includes the following domains: Planning, Instruction, Collaboration, and Professionalism. The evaluation for school counselors includes the domains of Planning, Program Management, Direct and Indirect Services, and Professionalism. The evaluation for school librarians includes the domains of Instruction, Environment, Library Services and Management, and Professionalism.
- 3. Principals have reviewed evaluations and conducted end-of-year conferences with teachers. Evaluation results will be entered into SC LEAD and submitted to the SCDE by June 18<sup>th</sup>. Principal evaluations (PADEPP) will be completed and submitted by June 30<sup>th</sup>. Principals must self-assess and present evidence on the assigned standards. Standards 2 (Instructional Leadership) and 9 (Professional Development) are required annually for every principal.
- 4. The Academic Recovery Plan was submitted to the SCDE. The district's plan includes six goals that support students' learning loss in the areas of ELA and math. The measures include MAP assessments, SC Ready assessments, and graduation rate. The SCDE has contracted Education Elements to review all plans and provide feedback to districts.
- 5. The New Staff Orientation will be held on Thursday, July 8<sup>th</sup> from 8am 12:30pm. Dr. Liston will present an introduction to District Four, and Mr. Benfield and Mrs. Skinner will provide insurance, payroll, and retirement information.

Mrs. Britt McKinney provided the following information:

- 1. Schools announced Teachers of the Year before getting out for summer. Our District Teacher of the Year interviews will be held June 11, 2021, at the district office. The announcement of the winner will be at the Back to School Breakfast with all faculty and staff.
- 2. School Resource Officers and Administrators are preparing for the 2021-2022 school year by updating plans and providing training to staff. All schools will continue to have a School Resource Office for next year.
- 3. Grants awarded to Spartanburg Four for the 2021-2022 school year are Title I, Title II, Title III, Title IV, Career and Technology, ESSER I, ESSER II, and ESSER III. These grants will be submitted for approval as soon as possible. The Federal Programs Advisory Committee met to discuss options for funds and how to meet the needs of students.
- 4. The district office is closing the testing center for the summer and will no longer be offering this service to the faculty and staff.

Mrs. Jennifer Turner provided the following information:

- 1. All schools continue the scheduling process for the 2021-2022 school year with course requests and grade level assignments.
- 2. Performance Task Assessment results for placement in the academically gifted program have arrived. An additional 21 students will receive academic services through the gifted program for the upcoming year.
- 3. Summer school sessions for Woodruff Primary School, Woodruff Elementary School, and Woodruff Middle School began today. Hours of operation are Monday-Thursday 7:45 am-2:15 pm and 7:45 am-12:00 pm on Friday. Woodruff High School began their first summer session on Thursday, June 3<sup>rd</sup>.
- 4. The 2020-2021 South Carolina School Report Cards are scheduled to post on October 1, 2021. As with last year's report card, many reporting elements have been waived due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
