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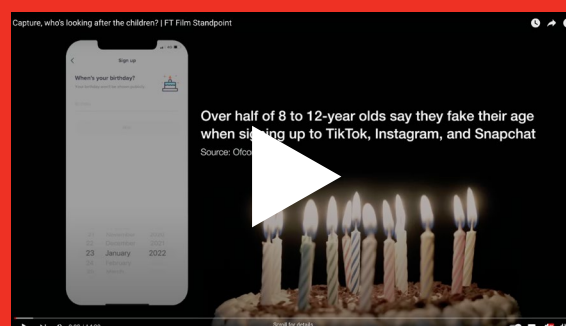

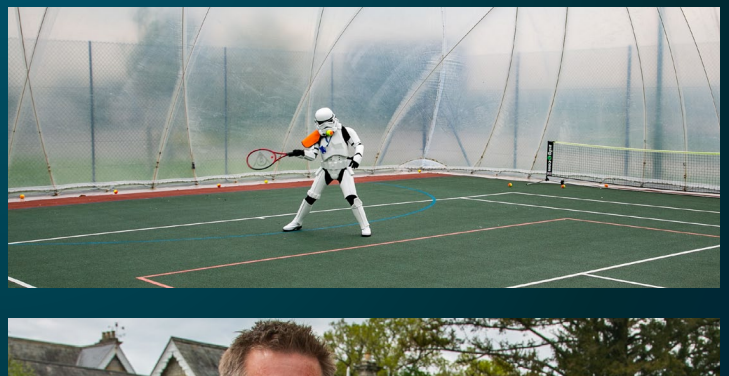

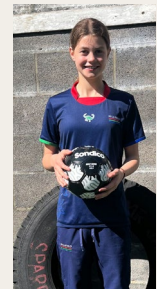


MAY FAIR

In the second game the girls posted a slightly under par 75 with **Chloe** making a strong 19 runs. Despite fine bowling figures from **Agi** of 3-10 the girls narrowly lost in the penultimate over. A brilliant start to the season and always good to achieve an early victory against county opposition.



The U11A cricket team played exceptionally well on Saturday. We had two very tight games against Gloucestershire. Well done on a great performance.



The U13B team had an excellent victory against Taunton this week, winning by 10 wickets. What made it all the more special is that we had to play with 10 players due to illness and every member of the team bowled at least one over during the Taunton innings as we restricted them to 89 runs from their 20 overs. **Thomas K** caught four catches, backing up good bowling with fine fielding. Captain **Rayaan V** scored 32 off 29 balls and shared a 62 run opening stand with **Jacob G** (17 runs) before both players retired. Well done to all involved.



The Senior Development team played East Wales in a 35-over match. East Wales posted 123-7 and in reply Millfield chased the target down with seven overs to spare for the loss of two wickets. **Connor P** scored 48 and **Rupert J** scored 39n.o. A very good win.

Dorset came next for the team in another 35-over match. Dorset 147-8 in their allotted overs. **Alex** took 3-17. Millfield were seven runs short in the chase for seven down. A great effort against a very strong bowling attack.

Wells Cathedral came next in the County Cup. Millfield scored 148-7 in 20 overs. **Hugo B** scored 32, **Rupert J** scored 31 and **Connor P** scored 30. In reply, Wells scored 49 in 16.1 overs. **Reuben L-J** took 4-14.

With this win the boys played Taunton in the next round in a 25-overs match. The boys struggled to 98-9, with **Ed W** scoring 33. Taunton chased the target down with 4.4 overs to spare and won by three wickets. **Reuben L-J** was superb with 4-8 while **Joel G** also claimed four dismissals.

The boys are showing good potential and with these matches they can learn from their experiences to develop their game.

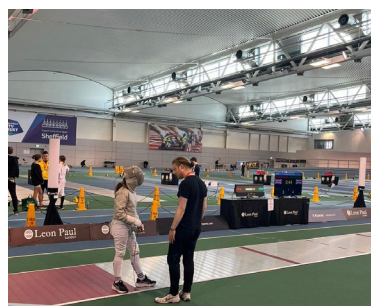

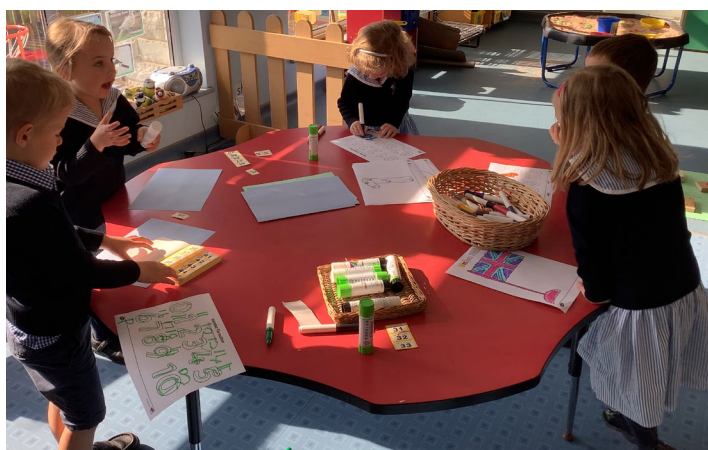
ROYAL FOREST SCHOOL
