NYSED approved the Regulation specific to usage of Indigenous Peoples names, symbols and mascots in the State of New York.


#### April 21, 2023

ross New York State have a warm, welcoming learning environment to learn, grow, and thrive. Th partment has discussed this matter internally and have consulted with the Indigenous Mascot Visory Group, a group the Department convened to provide NYSED with guidance on school mas ues from an Indigenous perspective. Subsequent to the Department's 2001 memo from then missioner Mills, reinforced by the <u>November 2022 Memo</u> from Senior Deputy Commissioner Ji Idwin, at the December 2022 Board of Regents meeting, NYSED proposed regulations regarding a abibition on the use of Indigenous team names, mascots, and logos by public schools. A notice of popced Rulemaking (see page 33) was then published in the State Register on December 28, 2022 50-day public comment period. Following the 60-day comment period, which has ended, and if opted at the April 17-18, 2023 Board of Regents meeting, the Department will develop guidance regulations with a broad range of stakeholders that will be shared with the field. Based on the mments received, we do not expect any significant revisions to the proposed regulations that will quire another round of publication and comment period.
