RCHS Procedures

- Main Doors open at 8:30am for students Students that arrive early will have to wait outside of the school building until opening time indicated. All students must enter the building with a mask. Students that are not eating breakfast will report directly to the auditorium for our daily morning meeting.
 Students that are eating breakfast will report to the cafeteria.
- RPS has been at the medium or low CDC community level since the beginning of September. Therefore, the updated guidance for COVID-19 makes masks optional for all students and staff both indoors and outdoors.
- All students will eat lunch together this year. Lunch will take place after 2nd period classes. Lunch times will vary based on the bell schedule of the day. We have three primary bell schedules (Regular, Activity, and Family/Club), which you can find on our website: rchs.rvaschools.net/about-us/bell-schedule
- All students must use the sign in/out system when leaving their classroom after receiving permission from their teacher. This is standard practice for our school culture.
- We will implement our 10/10 rule, which indicates no movement in the building during the first ten minutes and last ten minutes of class, unless it's an emergency.

10th & 11th Grade ONLY

This spring our school, in cooperation with the Virginia Department of Education and the Virginia Office of Education Economics, is participating in an international evaluation of career readiness. As part of this evaluation a career readiness survey will be given to **students in 10th and 11th grades**. This evaluation aims to benchmark the career guidance system in Virginia including an examination of the key features of the system and career readiness of young people. This review will shed light on how young people experience, explore, and navigate their future pathways.

I am writing to provide you with information on the student survey. The survey will be completed online using computers at school. The survey does not ask for your student's name and all answers are anonymous (no one will know how your student answered the survey). There is a copy of the survey available at school for your review.

The majority of survey questions are pulled directly from the Programme for International Student Assessment (PISA) Survey https://www.oecd.org/pisa/ This survey has been fielded globally since the year 2000 in more than 90 countries to 3 million students worldwide.

All students in grades 10 and 11 will be asked to participate. The survey is voluntary, and your student can decide not to participate. No action will be taken against you, your student, or the school if you do not participate. Arrival/Dismissal

Below is a very important message from our Safety & Security Department after evaluating our dismissal and traffic process. Please adhere to these guidelines. Parent pickup and drop-off is at the front of the building on E. Brookland Park Blvd. Students and parents should be using the crosswalks at each corner to safely cross the street. Mid-block crossing is dangerous, and visibility is limited. Drivers should follow traffic laws at all times. To avoid traffic collisions, no U-turns should be done in the middle of the street. We want all students and their families to arrive and depart safely at all times.

Please avoid using Woodrow Ave if possible, as this street is used for bus arrival and dismissal. If you have to use Woodrow Ave. when buses are loading and unloading, **vehicles are to remain stopped while the stop sign is out and flashing red.** (https://law.lis.virginia.gov/vacode/46.2-859) There is a fine of \$250 for violations of passing a stopped school bus.
