The District annually contracts with Burnham Benefits to provide various Affordable Care Act (ACA) services like filing of the 1094 and 1095-C forms that employees receive every year. LUSD's current ACA contract with Burnham expires July 31, 2023.

This three-month project-based consulting proposal is for Burnham to provide the District with consulting and strategic benefit planning with respect to employee benefit programs and includes counseling about funding alternatives, reviewing fee proposals, recommending budgets, contributions, and COBRA rates, and also includes assessing the District's existing in-house retiree billing to move it toward a direct-billing system like used in many other districts.

The \$6,750 per month consulting would occur during May, June, and July of 2023, and will have a fiscal impact of \$20,250. The funding sources is Restricted Local Funds.

After the 90-day consulting services concludes, the District may terminate the agreement and move forward with only an ACA agreement, or renew into a full-service one-year agreement which would include benefit planning and consulting as well as required ACA services at a rate of \$6,750 per month or \$81,000 for the period of August 1, 2023 until July 31, 2024.
