Talk Sup Week 33 Review and Preview

May 8, 2023

Good morning Sayreville! I hope you had a relaxing and enjoyable holiday weekend. Welcome to another edition of Talk Sup, my weekly newsletter. Please also remember that we will **dismiss students** <u>early next</u> **Monday, May 15th**, so that our staff can participate in professional development.



If you did not have a chance to attend the Board of Education (BOE) Business Meeting held on Tuesday, May 2, 2023, here is what you missed. Morgan Koonce from the Sayreville Middle School (SMS) began the meeting by providing her Student Council Representative to the Board of Education Report. Next, Mr. Esposito expressed his opening remarks, as did Mrs. Bloom, who



also shared some district highlights. During the presentation portion of the meeting, the district presented the 2023-24 School District Budget and held the required public hearing before voting on it. It also presented the district's New Jersey Department of Education approved 2021-22 Harassment, Intimidation, or Bullying Grades. To view this presentation, click here.

The Board then held a public hearing on the 2023-24 School District Budget. After that, it moved the action items from the Superintendent's Report onto the Board Agenda and approved them all. Among other motions, on the Vision 2030 Finance and Infrastructure portion of the agenda, the BOE approved and adopted the aforementioned 2023-2024 School District Budget in the total amount of \$140,059,037. In addition, the Board accepted the generous donation of \$200 for the Bombers Beyond 18-21-Year-Old Program by the South Amboy Knights of Columbus. It also approved contracts with McCabe Environmental Services for asbestos abatement for the HVAC replacement project at Dwight D. Eisenhower Elementary School in the amount of \$38,919; and clearance air sampling for the floor replacement project at Jesse Selover Elementary School in the amount of \$5,470.00 to be paid using Preschool Expansion Aid funds.

On the Governance portion of the agenda, the Board of Education approved the following job descriptions:

Assistant Superintendent of Pupil and Special Services; Director of Early Childhood Curriculum and Instruction; Director of Special Projects; Professional Development, Intervention Services,

Innovation, and Grant Writing; Preschool Intervention and Referral Specialist (PIRS); and FullTime Business Office Support Secretary. Click on each to read them. It also approved new preschool start and end times for the 2023-24 School Year, which will essentially begin and end 15 minutes earlier.

On the Personnel portion of the agenda, as well as other motions, the Board of Education accepted the retirement of Kimberly Davey, Social Studies Teacher at the Sayreville Middle School (SMS), effective

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January 1, 2024. It also approved the appointment of a non-certificated staff member for the 2022-23 school year, and the transfer of certificated and non-certificated staff for the 2022-23 and 2023-24 school years. In addition, the BOE appointed advisors and their stipends for the 2022-23 school year.

During the Open Public Comment portion of the meeting, a representative from the Middlesex County College Teen Arts Program thanked the Board of Education for allowing Teen Arts to lease district facilities for an upcoming event. During the Board Discussion portion of the meeting, Mr. Fernandez reviewed what was discussed during the last Student Achievement Committee Meeting, as did Ms. Napolitano for the last Governance Committee Meeting, and Mrs. Pieloch for the last Personnel Committee Meeting. Mrs. Bloom shared news from the Middlesex County School Boards Association, as did Mr. Fernandez regarding the Sayreville/South Amboy Rotary Club, and Ms. Napolitano regarding the Educational Services Commission of New Jersey.

The next meeting will take place at 7:30 pm on Tuesday, May 16th in the SUES Board Room. During this meeting, the district will recognize and honor the 2022-23 Governors Educators of the Year, Magic 98.5 Teachers that Make Magic, and the SEA Education Support Professionals of the Year recipients. The agenda for this meeting will be posted on the district website on Friday, May 12th. 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
