



for Incoming 7th Grade


Dear future 7th grader,

In order to prepare for the English curriculum next year, we ask that you read a minimum of TWO books this summer. Please select at least one of the texts from the back of this sheet and ONE book of your choice. We would like you to read a minimum of two books, but we highly encourage you to read four to six books. We also encourage you to read books that you have not already read. Please be aware that some of these books contain mature themes and content, so share your book choice with a parent/guardian. **If you choose a nonfiction book, please choose a fiction book, too.**

As you read, record your thinking for ONE book on Post-It Notes, a Google Doc, or a piece of paper. Record questions, connections, important details, surprising moments, characterization/behavior, conflict, and the things you wondered throughout the book. We ask that you pay special attention to overall theme and plot. Your first writing assignment in English 7 will be a written response on a choice text you read over the summer, and you will want to bring a copy of the book with your notes for that first writing assignment.
