For the 2021-22 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2018-19. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2017-18. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or had a graduation rate at or below 67% in 2016-17. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Our school has not been given one of these labels.

To meet the challenges we face regarding reading and math instruction we are planning intensive small group instruction. In addition, our district has continued to strengthen our MTSS (Multi-Tiered System of Supports) to address our challenges in reading and behavior. MTSS provides resources essential to the transformation of instructional practices, offering initiatives that support personalized learning, school culture shifts, common professional development, and extended learning opportunities for all students and staff. Our School Leadership Team provides oversight and support to the district administrative leadership and building leadership to ensure the full and effective implementation of a Multi-Tiered System of Supports to ensure student success.

PROCESS FOR ASSIGNING PUPILS TO THE SCHOOL

Westwood is the only school serving the 3rd through 5th grade students attending Portland Public Schools, all students in those grades are assigned to Westwood.

THE STATUS OF THE 3-5 YEAR SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN

Westwood Elementary School has a comprehensive school improvement plan designed and implemented by the staff, teachers, administrators, and parent volunteers. It includes parent involvement activities, professional development, academic goals, professional research, a comprehensive needs assessment, and research based strategies for improving academic achievement for and amongst our students. There is much focus on differentiated instruction and additional math and reading instruction. We appreciate the continued support of parents, staff and our community in this effort. The Michigan State Board of Education has developed a model Core Curriculum for school districts to use. Core curriculum is defined as a set of learning objectives (Grade Level Content Expectations or GLCEs and the Common Core State Standards or CCSS) that all students are expected to achieve. Westwood teachers work actively to ensure that our curriculum is aligned with the expectations provided by the state. We utilize common unit assessments in the core curricular areas which are continually under development. They reinforce and support the achievement progress made on the M-STEP.

- A. Utilizing NWEA Reading assessments, over 92% of Westwood students in 2021-2022 school year demonstrated a year's worth of growth.
- B. Utilizing Acadience Reading assessments, Westwood students in 2021-2022 demonstrated over 1 year of academic growth.

IDENTIFY THE NUMBER AND PERCENT OF STUDENTS REPRESENTED BY PARENTS AT PARENT TEACHER CONFERENCES

- A. Conferences are held at Westwood Elementary twice a year, in October and again in March. In October 2020, we had 97% of our students represented. In March 2021, 98% of our students were represented at conferences.
