I wanted to share two fantastic pieces of Centaurus news from this past week.

First, on Wednesday, our very own Terry Fostvedt was awarded the Impact on Education Award for Centaurus High School. For those of you who do not know Terry, she has a long tenure at Centaurus High School as an Language Arts teacher who has taught at every level including our in our IB program. She has also long served as mentor teacher to aspiring educators, and there are numerous teachers in our school and in the state of Colorado who started their careers under her tutelage. Second, Centaurus High School with JWill Pink Village to help create heart-shaped pillows to send home with patients following mastectomy surgery.
