Together we work to reduce recidivism among our youth and increase their chance of academic and personal success.






WHO WE SERVE

MIDDLE SCHOOL ADVOCATES

In addition to our 4 regional Advocates, our program provides services to four middle schools in Yakima County. With one Advocate stationed at each middle school, we can provide more intensive services. Services can also extend to other middle schools in the region as needed.

SERVICES WE PROVIDE

- Provide transitional services
- Conduct home visits
- Assess student needs
- Link youth to services in schools
- Support academic progress
- Provide mentoring
- Support post-secondary schooling opportunities
- Offer alternative learning options
- Refer youth to additional resources
- Teach Dialectical Behavioral Therapy (DBT) skills

REFERRAL PROCESS

Referrals can by sent by parole officers, probation counselors, school staff, community members, and family. All referrals are made through our electronic referral form. Upon completion, our Referral Coordinator will assign an Education Advocate to each youth depending on residence location.
