Overarching Theme: Use data to improve outcomes

Domain 1: Student Achievement

• 1.1 Increase the percentage of student achievement metrics categorized as Above and Well Above from the 2023 Spring PSSA/Keystone Exam data file compared to the 2022 levels.

Domain 2: District Culture

- 2.1 Measurably improve communication and collaboration with shareholder groups (staff, parents, students, and community members).
- 2.2 Measurably improve college and career readiness of PGHS students.

Theory of Action:

If we...

- Program a rigorous curriculum aligned to PA Core Standards;
- Engage teachers in a feedback/reflection cycle of inquiry;
- Employ data to inform instructional decisions; and
- Identify and provide instructional support for all students

Then we will...

- Improve instructional practice;
- Improve student achievement for all students; and
- Improve the value to our community.

Goal 1.1 - Increase the percentage of student achievement metrics categorized as *Above* and *Well Above* from the 2023 Spring PSSA/Keystone Exam data file compared to the 2022 levels.

- **Performance Metrics** The goal will be considered met if the percentage of multiple metrics (Student Achievement, Growth, and Comparison Group metrics) categorized as Above or Well Above from the 2023 Spring PSSA/Keystone Exam datafile exceeds 2022 levels.
- Reporting
 - 2022 PSSA/Keystone Exam data will be presented to the Curriculum, Instruction, and Technology committee at the September 2022 meeting.
 - 2023 PSSA/Keystone Exam data will be presented to the Curriculum, Instruction, and Technology committee at the September 2023 meeting or as they become available.

District Action Plans:

- Implement instructional coaching model K-12
- Implement MTSS in Grades K-8
- Increase instructional time in ELA and Mathematics in Grades 6-8
- Implement new curricular materials in ELA K-12
- Curricular development of Text Dependent Analysis (TDA) in Grades 4-8

Theory of Action:

If we...

- Engage all stakeholders in a meaningful way;
- Engage students in meaningful college & career readiness activities;
- Improve metrics for supporting and measuring student outcomes;
- Develop programs to meet the needs of all students; and
- Augment existing community service projects

Then we will...

- Improve students' college and career readiness;
- Provide students with a competitive advantage for post-secondary success;
- Affirm the value of student service to students and the community; and
- Strengthen the connection with our community.

Goal 2.1 Measurably improve communication and collaboration with shareholder groups (staff, parents, students, and community members).

- **Performance Metrics** The goal will be considered met if there is a measurable increase in the number of respondents and the percentage of positive responses from Beginning-of-Year and End-of-Year survey and by the creation of additional communication avenues.
- Reporting
 - Beginning-of-Year data presented to Board (Sep-Oct)
 - End-of-Year data presented to Board (June)

Goal 2.2 Measurably improve college and career readiness of PGHS students.

- **Performance Metrics** the goal will be considered met if there is evidence in growth of College and Career Measures (Future Ready Index) (33%), growth in internship enrollments (33%), and growth in the percentage of PGHS students successfully completing Advanced Placement (AP) exams or Dual Enrollment (DE) coursework (33%).
- **Reporting** Progress will be reported to the CIT committee
 - Mid-Year update January 2023
 - Enrollment update June 2023
 - College & Career Measures June 2023
 - AP and DE report July 2023

Goal 2.3 Strengthen community relations and have students experience the "ethic" and "benefit" of community service by increasing the number of service projects and the number of students participating in these projects.

- **Performance Metrics** The goal will be considered met if we increase the number of unique students participating in service projects and increase the number of service projects
- **Reporting** Progress will be reported to the Athletics, Co-curricular, and Community Relations Committee
 - Mid-year update January 2023
 - End-of-year update June 2023

Domain 3 – Safety & Advocacy

Theory of Action:

If we...

- Continue to enhance school safety and security;
- Strengthen partnerships with local first responders; and
- Support the physical, emotional, and academic needs of all students.

Then we will...

- Ensure the safety of staff and students;
- Improve student outcomes.

Goal 3.1 Ensure all buildings are in 100% compliance with updated safety measures, protocols, required procedures, lab safety, and the Health & Safety Plan. Identify and implement high-impact safety and security modifications.

- **Performance Metrics** The goal will be considered met if all district safety measures, protocols, and procedures are updated and all buildings are in full compliance (50%); and if high-impact safety and security modifications are successfully implemented (50%).
- **Reporting** Progress will be reported to the Operations/Facilities Committee
 - Mid-year update, January 2023
 - End-of-year update, May 2023

Goal 3.2 Reduce discipline referrals from 2021-22 data by 2% per building, with a quarterly goal of 150 positive referrals per building (K-8).

- Performance Metrics The goal will be considered met if behavioral data from Powerschool Log Entries, SWISS data, and the Safe Schools Report show at least a 2% decrease in disciplinary referrals and PBIS data shows at least 150 positive referrals for each building.
- Reporting quarterly.

Goal 3.3 Fully implement Multi-Tiered System of Supports (MTSS) in grades K-8. Design and begin implementation of MTSS in grades 9-12.

- Performance Metrics The goal will be considered met if by the end of 2022-23, PGSD has fully implemented MTSS in grades K-8 (75%) and has begun MTSS implementation in grades 9-12 (25%).
- Reporting quarterly.

Goal 3.4 Students in K-8 will demonstrate positive Social and Emotional Learning (SEL) growth as evidenced by pre and post assessment data.

- Performance Metrics The goal will be considered met if at least 80% of students demonstrate positive growth in social emotional learning (SEL) as measured by DESSA pre & post assessment.
- Reporting twice annually (baseline data and end of year data)

Goal 4.1 Design and implement a Middle School schedule to increase the amount of instructional time in ELA and Math as well as an Intervention/Enrichment Period.

- **Performance Metrics** The goal will be considered met if a Middle School schedule is implemented that increases ELA and Math instructional time as well as includes an Intervention/Enrichment period.
- **Reporting -** September CIT Committee

Goal 4.2 Fully implement a dashboard to support MTSS and data-informed instructional practice using multiple data sources.

- **Performance Metrics** -The goal will be considered met if the data dashboard is fully implemented
- Reporting Quarterly

Goal 4.3 Implement live-streaming of sporting events and activities for 3 High School sites.

- **Performance Metrics** The goal will be considered met if all 3 sites have implemented live-streaming.
- **Reporting -** Periodically and June 2023.

Goal 4.4 Standardize procedures districtwide documented in Administrative Regulations (AR).

- **Performance Metrics** The goal will be considered met if all applicable policies have an accompanying AR.
- **Reporting -** June 2023

Goal 4.5 Develop and implement an elementary gradebook and report cards in PowerSchool.

- **Performance Metrics** The goal will be considered met if PGSD has implemented elementary gradebook and report cards for the 2023-24 school year.
- **Reporting -** Periodically and June 2023

Then we will...

• Ensure that District funds are optimally invested.

Goal 5.1 Manage 2022-23 expenditures within budget.

- **Performance Metrics** The goal will be considered met if 2022-23 expenditures are less than 2022-23 budgeted expenditures.
- **Reporting -** Periodically and June 2023

Goal 5.2 Redesign Pottsgrove Virtual Academy programming and re-enroll Pottsgrove students enrolled in out-of-district cyber charter schools.

- **Performance Metrics** The goal will be considered met if 2022-23 out-of-district cyber charter enrollments are 20% lower than 2021-22
- **Reporting -** Periodically and June 2023

Goal 5.3 Develop and present a 5-year projection of enrollment and financial well-being for the District.

- **Performance Metrics** The goal will be considered met if the District prepares a 5-year projection that includes protected enrollments based upon live birth data and housing start assumptions, capital projects, and other relevant financial components.
- **Reporting -** Quarterly
