. Call to order

Mrs. Goodman called to order the regular meeting of the MISD Livestock Committee at 6:12 PM on May 10, 2023

II. Approval of minutes from last meeting

Ms. Territo read the minutes from the last meeting. The minutes were approved as read. Mr. Ward reported the balance on hand which is \$68,574.63.

. New business

- a. Mr. Ward will book restrooms for show normally at the end of July early August.
 1. We were told that the bond would help build, in sections, to create an indoor concession, bathroom, and storage room during the summer. (might not need to contact about our regular restrooms if this happens in time)
- a. Buyer's gifts and clipboards were discussed and vendors will be contacted
 1. Don't actually need to buy because we have some left over. Some maroon blankets with our logo.
- b. Buyer's dinner location was decided – MHS cafeteria. (Goodman is booking this) Tables and chairs will be ordered (Mr. Ward). Two custodians are needed.
- c. We need to contact K&C, Flemings, and Fishers as processors for the show. Capps contacted K&C about doing our grand and reserve. Smith is in contact with Flemings about showing up at that time.
- d. JK Graphics, Tejas Office Products, and Speed Printing of Conroe have been contacted to order save the date cards and invitations. At the moment I was told that they are behind and are being printed today. They will let me know when they are ready for pick up. Ms. Territo will contact them at the end of May for posters.
- e. Hutch is going to order the banners and buckles at the State Convention this summer.
- f. Clipboards we have. Got them after so we do not need to order any of those.
- g. Forms are counted.
 1. 2022 Post Sales prices:

1. Steers \$3500 (students payed \$2500 in the beginning)
2. Lambs \$450 (students payed \$400 in the beginning)
3. Goats \$450 (students payed \$450 in the beginning)
4. Pigs \$450(students payed \$240 in the beginning)
5. Rabbits \$250 (students payed \$225 in the beginning)
6. Poultry \$250 (students payed \$75 for turkeys & \$50 for broilers in the beginning)

2. 2023 Post Sale prices:

1. Steers \$3500 (students payed \$2500 in the beginning)
2. Lambs \$500 (students payed \$520 in the beginning)
3. Goats \$550 (students payed \$600 in the beginning)
4. Pigs \$450 (students payed \$250 in the beginning)
5. Rabbits \$300 (students payed \$295 in the beginning)
6. Poultry \$250 (students payed \$75 for turkeys & \$50 for broilers in the beginning)

h. The number of each species that will sell in the live auction was discussed as:

Steers – 5 (71%)
 Hogs – 22 (51%)
 Lambs – 11 (44%)
 Goats – 15 (42%)
 Rabbits – 15 (42%)
 Broilers – 7 (39%)
 Turkeys – 5 (42%)
 Total Lots: 80

- It was moved and seconded that these are the numbers we will sell in the auction.

i. Selection duties and expectations were discussed

1. Make sure you show up please. Lambs & Goats are more hectic than hogs.
2. Do we have needles & syringes? Capps is going to bring these. Mr. Ward has the ear tags and wing bands.

3. Last year we offered it to each kid. We are going to do that again this year just in case the kid doesn't want it.
4. If you are a parent and your child is selecting that species they are not allowed to help with selection of that species even after their child picks.
5. Only one parent needs to get out of the vehicle to help with selection(no switching out parents once one is out helping already). Your phone needs to stay in the car, no taking pictures during the selection process.
