

- 3. Identify and define circle
- 4. Identify and define circle shaped objects
- 5. Identify and define large and small circles
- 6. Identify circles in an illustration from text
- 7. Repeat steps 3-6 for square, rectangle, triangle, and oval
- 8. Identify all shapes from large image from the text
- 9. Identify and define how artists use overlapping
- 10. Overview project
- 11. Follow project steps to create shapes for forest
- 12. Identify and define different types of lines
- 13. Use different types of lines to make a pattern
- 14. Follow steps to glue in shapes to create a forest
- 15. Optional: Add extra steps to show the shape forest in a specific season
