ABOUT

St. Mary's Academy is the first archdiocesan PreK – 12 Catholic School. In 2000, Our Lady of Mercy Catholic High School opened its doors to students in grades 9 – 12. The Archbishop of Atlanta and the Catholic Schools Superintendent collaborated on a new vision for Our Lady of Victory and Our Lady of Mercy Schools that resulted in St. Mary's Academy. Families could now enroll all their children under one roof and enabled teachers and coaches to coordinate activities across the entire PreK – 12 educational spectrum.

St. Mary's Academy educates students to become Christ-centered, global-minded students positioned to pursue and achieve personal and professional goals for the 21st century. Students learn through inquirybased processes, allowing teachers to build on each child's curiosity. In this student-centered approach, teachers help students create a framework of questioning so that through investigating scenarios, data analysis, and the communication of findings, they increase information-processing skills and intellectual engagement.

St. Mary's Academy is accredited by and meets the standards of Cognia, the parent company of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS). Teachers maintain valid certification/teaching credentials. Students at all levels receive instruction in the core subjects of religion, literacy/language arts, mathematics, science, and social studies, as well as electives and enrichment programs.

Advisory Council

The mission of the St. Mary's Academy Advisory Council is to further the advancement of a quality Catholic education for the students attending SMA by providing leadership, advice, assistance and support to the Principal. Its authority is derived from the Archbishop of Atlanta, the Superintendent of Schools, and the Archdiocesan School Advisory Council.

SPIRITUAL LIFE

After receiving a Catholic education at St. Mary's, students are emboldened to answer the call to holiness and become change agents in every endeavor they pursue.

Spiritual life at St. Mary's Academy allows students to grow in faith, explore their interests, and feel safe, accepted, and encouraged. Faculty challenge students to integrate the values of Jesus Christ and the sacraments into their everyday lives. Service and outreach programs allow students to understand the importance of becoming servant leaders in their communities. As a result, graduates leave as compassionate individuals who respect other cultural and personal perspectives.

As a Catholic school, St. Mary's gives special attention to ensure that all academic and formative efforts integrate in such a way that the light of Christ's teaching illuminates everything students learn. The religious dimension of the school is expressed through the celebration of Christian values in Word and Sacrament, service to others, and in a community animated by faith, hope, and charity.

Lower School students serve the local community through age-appropriate service and works of mercy projects. These projects focus on the material and physical needs of the hungry, poor, homeless, sick, and less fortunate.

An interdisciplinary Campus Ministry team of faculty and staff collaborates to plan, implement, and assess spiritual life programming at St. Mary's Academy.

ACADEMIC PROGRAM

At St. Mary's Academy, we educate our students to become Christ-centered, global-minded students positioned to pursue and achieve personal and professional goals for the 21st century. SMA follows the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Atlanta curriculum standards for all subject areas. Standards adhere to State and in many cases national standards, preparing students to thrive in a rapidly changing world. As part of a comprehensive PK-12 curriculum framework, students graduate from SMA with the tools they need to meet the challenges of high school and beyond.

Elementary School: PreK - 3rd Grades

The primary and early elementary years are times when students begin forming friendships for the first time. It is also where a child will become excited about being in a class with his/ her peers to learn and play. The school employs a curriculum that develops each child's academic, cognitive, and physical behavior. St. Mary's develops life-long learners who are excited to learn.

Elementary School: 4th- 5th Grades

At SMA, students build strong executive functioning skills. Teachers help students develop organization, note-taking, planning skills, and setting goals and objectives. Students develop academic stamina and begin to apply it to long-term problem-solving skills. Through challenging Socratic seminars, they start to argue more than one side of an issue. St. Mary's students explore ideas, meaning, and information found in text. Teachers facilitate insightful discussions about the text they read, making text-to-text, text-to-world, and text-to-self

Middle School: 6th - 8th Grades

SMA understands the unique challenges facing middle school students. The school takes advantage of students' new ability to memorize information more easily in the classroom. Middle school students are learning to be flexible thinkers, and our faculty help our students learn to change approaches when needed. They work with students to build grammar and vocabulary knowledge, write from personal experiences, and work with what-if scenarios to solve problems.

High School: 9th – 12th Grades

Students typically take five core classes and two electives, allowing them to explore subjects of interest. In addition, distinguished teachers work with students in Honors and AP courses to tackle the coursework challenges. AP courses are college-level courses that culminate with an AP Exam offered by the College Board and may count for college credit.

STEM Center for Innovation

The SMA Center for Innovation is a vital facet of the school community. It brings students together through a hive of connected spaces as a community of artists, scientists, innovators, explorers, readers, and learners. The Center for Innovation is home to the media center, collaborative workspaces, conference room, and two Innovative Learning Labs to host maker spaces, digital media, and gaming/e-sports interests.

Media Center

The Media Center is housed within the Center For Innovation. It is a gathering place for reading classes, research, and collaboration. The Media Center houses more than 8,000 volumes, periodicals, reference sources, and two databases through Ebsco.

The mission of the Library Media Center Program is to support the school curriculum through a variety of resources, to educate students and staff on becoming effective users of ideas, information, and literature, and to nurture a love for lifelong reading.

THE ARTS

St. Mary's celebrates the Arts. The Arts change the learning environment into

THE POSITION

In this increasingly popular structure, the Principal reports to the President and serves as the day-to-day leader of academic operations including all aspects of the student experience – from the classroom to the playing fields, to faith formation, and extracurricular programing.

The Office of the President's primary purpose to provide broad leadership for the St. Mary's Academy school community to achieve the fullest realization of its Catholic mission. The President, in collaboration with the Principal and respective school leaders, is equally responsible for the successful overall operation of the school through effective delegation of responsibilities to the administrative team, faculty, and staff.

The President is appointed by and reports directly to the Superintendent of Catholic Schools and partners with the school's Advisory Board, The President serves as the chief advancement and strategic officer while leading constituents and stakeholders in implementing the Archdiocese's vision for the school. In doing so, the President serves as a public face of St. Mary's Academy community and is directly responsible for its external affairs, for ensuring sufficient resources, sound fiscal management, and its financial stability through direct oversight of the business operations. The President is supported by a highly skilled senior leadership team and will play an active role in overseeing the school's alumni and community relations, advancement initiatives, enrollment management activities, and facilities and infrastructure needs.

ABOUT THE AREA

Fayetteville is a city in and the county seat of Fayette County, Georgia. As of the 2020 census, the city had a population of just under 20,000, up from nearly 16,000 at the 2010 census. Fayetteville is located 22 miles south of downtown Atlanta.

Trilith Studios, then Pinewood Atlanta Studios, opened in Fayetteville in 2014. In 2020, River Rock bought out Pinewood's share of the studio. It is the largest film and television production studio in the United States outside the state of California. The studio has produced many large budget films, including several in the Marvel Cinematic Universe such as Avengers: Infinity War, Avengers: Endgame, and Black Panther.

In 2016, the Pinewood Forest mixed-use complex was launched. Located across the street from the studio, it features homes along with plans for "a movie theater, restaurants, boutique hotels, retail and office space", built using environmentally friendly building materials. In 2020, when the studio was renamed Trilith Studios, Pinewood Forest was renamed the Town at Trilith. In April 2021, Atlanta magazine ranked the community ninth in their top ten metro Atlanta vibrant city centers list.
