3) Superintendent Report

Torrie Osbon

- The district has received two awards for our 21st Century program. The first one is a five-year continuation grant for the high school worth \$490,000. The second one is a one-year \$29,000 supplemental grant for the middle school.
- Thank you to Molly Rigsby (classified employee of the month) and the entire 21st Century staff at all of our schools for supporting students beyond the regular school day.
- Also, best of luck to the 21st Century production of the Lion King Jr., which is taking place tonight and tomorrow night in the auditorium. Students from all three schools are performing in the musical.

- Thank you to the board members for their support of our 21st Century program. The staff welcomes input and ideas to help make the program grow.

- There are a couple of BG1s on the agenda that I can talk about if you have questions.
- Also on the agenda is a new contract for our nurse program with Cumberland Family Medical Center, Inc.

Superintendent Josh Hurt

- Mr. Trotter can also answer any questions about item 5G, which is the amended 2022-2023 school calendar. We actually returned from Christmas break on January 3 instead of January 2 so the calendar has to be officially amended and sent to the state. It was a miscommunication and doesn't affect any other calendar dates.
- Mrs. Dial and our deeper learning team have been working hard. We had a productive community meeting a couple of hours ago. We want to make sure our schools, teachers, parents, community, and employers are on the same page when it comes to the needs of our students. We are working harder on the success of each individual student. While meeting traditional academic needs, we want to make sure we are putting value on other important skills and competencies. We are relooking at how we measure success so that students can contribute to the community after graduation.
- We had a great turnout for this morning's AP Breakfast and Senior Celebrity banquet last night.
- Action item 5A is a partnership agreement with the University of the Cumberlands that will help teacher aids along their path to becoming a certified teachers.
- Action item 5C is a KETS 2nd offer of assistance. If approved, the district will match the \$12,302.55. We plan on using the money to replace aging Chromebooks.
- The nurse contract with Cumberland Family Medical Center, Inc. does not impact our athletic trainers with TJ Samson. It was an amicable decision among all parties to make the switch for our nurses and nurse practitioner.
- Action items 5D and 5E are BG1s to consider. The first will expand the multi-purpose center beside the softball field. The building would double in size. Space is limited right now because softball, football, archery, and 21st Century use the building. Some of that funding will include an art room expansion to house a kiln that has been donated to the high school. 5E is the BG1 that would allow us to construct an athletic complex. The BG1 gets us started. It's about a \$6.6 million project. In this project, there are plans for renovations of current facilities as well as adding new facilities. There will also be parking lot improvements.

- Students took the PSAT on March 21. 50 students increased their overall benchmark and received \$50 from the math grant. Last year there were 30 winners.
- MAP testing wrapped up, and we saw big increases. 64% of 6th graders are at or above benchmark in reading and 61% in math. 65% of 7th graders are at or above benchmark in reading and 49% in math. And, 71% of 8th graders are at or above benchmark in reading and 62% in math.
