
All Your Twisted Secrets by Diana Urban (Gr. 10-12)




The Bridge by Bill Konigsberg (Gr. 10-12) CW: Suicide

Aaron and Tillie don't know each other, but they are both feeling suicidal, and arrive at the George Washington Bridge at the same time, intending to jump. On the bridge, there are four things that could happen: Aaron jumps and Tillie doesn't. Tillie jumps and Aaron doesn't. They both jump. Neither of them jumps. Or maybe all four things happen, in this astonishing and insightful novel from Bill Konigsberg.

Cemetery Boys by Aiden Thomas (Gr. 7-9)

Yadriel, a trans boy, summons the angry spirit of his high school's bad boy, and agrees to help him learn how he died, thereby proving himself a brujo, not a bruja, to his conservative family.





Charming as a Verb by Ben Philippe (Gr. 7-9)

Hiding less-than-honest business practices behind his charming smile and Ivy League ambition, a popular Haitian-American star debater is blackmailed by an intense classmate who wants to improve her image at school.

Clap When You Land by Elizabeth Acevedo (Gr. 10-12)

An evocative novel in verse by the National Book Award-winning author of The Poet X follows the experiences of two grieving sisters who navigate the loss of their father and the impact of his death on their relationship.





Displacement by Kiku Hughes (Gr. 7-9)

On a visit to San Francisco, Kiku finds herself transported in time back to the 1940s Japanese-American internment camp that her late grandmother, Ernestina, was forcibly relocated to during World War II.

Firekeeper's Daughter by Angeline Boulley (Gr 10-12)

Treated like an outsider in both her hometown and on the Ojibwe reservation, a half-Native American science geek and star hockey player places her dreams on hold in the wake of a family tragedy.





The Gilded Ones by Namina Forna (Gr. 7-9)

Deka's life changes when her blood runs gold during her blood ceremony. Marked as an outcast, Deka is given a choice, submit to her fate in the village or leave to join the emperor's army of girls like herself. On her way to the capital to join, Deka learns there are more surprises than she was aware of, and nobody, not even Deka, are what they seem.

When legendary R&B artist Korey Fields spots Enchanted Jones at an audition, her dreams of being a famous singer take flight. 
