

The Anthony Lenard Hunter Memorial Scholarship

Mr. Anthony L. Hunter was a 1975 Graduate of Savannah State College (University). He worked 25 years as a Mathematics teacher at Effingham County High School; he loved teaching and mentoring students. Students had the utmost respect for him; many of whom continued to seek guidance from him after his retirement in 2005. Mr. Hunter was earnest, loyal and industrious. After retirement he expanded - nationwide "Hunters Pride," the family owned Bar-be que sauce business. Serving as the Chairman of Deacons at the Macedonia Missionary Baptist Church until his demise on January 31, 2017 his life was the epitome of courage, vision and deep faith. He was a member of the Springfield Central High School Association Inc. and a Parent University-Effingham Volunteer. Giving of his time and resources to support the efforts of the organization. Mr. Hunter was self-sacrificing always giving and available to share an encouraging word. This scholarship will be a living monument to his foresight and indefatigable devotion to youth, to education and to humanity.

The recipient of the scholarship must:

- Be a senior enrolled at Effingham County High school.
- Submit a copy of the letter of acceptance from the college/university/technical college the student plans to attend.
- Submit an official copy of the student's most recent academic transcript, signed by the appropriate school official, and stamped with the seal of the school.
- Complete an application and submit three letters of recommendation from an adult non-family member. 1) From a community service agency describing your volunteerism, 2) From a church official 3) the other recommendation may be from a mentor, teacher, youth leader, co-worker etc.

Application Guidelines

1. Scholarship will be paid to the college/university/technical college the applicant attends. However, if student fails to enroll, the funds will be returned to the donor.
2. Applicant's financial needs must be established. A statement of financial need must be included. The statement may be obtained from a school counselor, school social worker, member of the clergy or a social service agency. This information will be kept confidential to the scholarship committee.
3. Scholarship may be used toward any degree.
4. The applicant must have a 2.8 GPA or above.
5. The application and all documents must be completed and submitted to Mrs. Mimi Hayes in the counselor's office by April 30, 2023.
