

WHAT IS ACCELERATED READER (AR)?

• AR is a free online program that your child ALREADY uses at school. AR encourages students to keep reading at home because your child can earn AR points from reading books and passing quick 10-question quizzes.

HOW DOES AR WORK?

- Read almost any book--books from home, from a <u>Little Free Library</u>, or on our <u>EPIC</u> <u>website</u> (code <u>njc6737</u>).
- Log onto AR.
- Take a short quiz.
- Earn points.

HOW CAN I HELP MY CHILD?

- Encourage your child to read at least 20 minutes per day.
- Set aside a time each day.
- Read to or with your child.
- Help your child find things to read that he/she is interested in.
- Talk about the books that your child is reading, and read together at bedtime.
- After each book, help your child log onto AR.


