DCS will purchase access to the iReady Reading and Math assessment, instructional, and Toolbox materials for K-9th grades as well as students needing Tier III intervention in grades 10-12. The materials align with the ALCOS and was one of the recommended programs for K-3rd grade assessment requirements. The curriculum reinforces grade level concepts and creates pathways for students based on their assessments and growwth within the program. Students have access to iReady at school or at home.

The iReady assessment program is one tool which helps to identify those students who are at-risk and in need of more spoecialized instruction. The program not only builds pathways for the student to complete online, the report for teachers includes lesson plans that can be used in small groups to meet the specific needs identified for those students. This will be most helpful in writing IEPs, ELPs, 504, and PST/RTI plans as well as in monitoring progress toward those plan goals and objectives.

iReady provides letters and reports designed specifically so that parents can understand where their children are performing and what they need to do in order to 'catch-up' to their peers.

iReady provides some instructional assistance in Spanish so that when students are having trouble understanding a concept, they can attempt the lesson in their native language to see if that helps them better understand.

The iReady program will be used to help provide instruction for our students in the summer school program as well.

For iReady there will be a beginning of the year assessment and an end of the year assessment as well as progress monitoring throughout the year.

We will use the end of year assessment and a progress monitoring assessment at the end of our summer program to assess student gains during the summer school program.

What is the proposed timeline for providing services and assistance to students and staff?

This program will begin in May of 2021 (but some professional development will begin in January of 2021) and continue through August of 2022.
