Citizen Comments

The Citizen Comments section provides an opportunity for public comment on any item concerning public education. Speakers must be Lawrence County residents, or the parent/guardian of a child attending Lawrence County Schools, or employed by Lawrence County Schools. Speakers are required to state their full name and address before speaking.

A timer is displayed in front of the board station. Speakers are provided three minutes to fully present his or her position on a particular issue. A speaker may not delegate his or her time to another person and speakers will not be limited unless they become repetitive and/or no new information is provided.

Speakers will not be permitted to make any disparaging remarks, comments or statements pertaining to the good name and character of any individual. Any speaker doing so will forfeit the remainder of his/her time.

Speakers should not expect any Board action or response on a request or comment expressed publicly during the Citizen Comments portion of the agenda. The Board and Superintendent will listen to all expressed concerns, issues, or requests, and may respond at a later date.

Audience members must remain in their seats during citizen comments and follow the directions of the Superintendent, board, and staff.

- 2.5.5 Public Participation – In order to permit orderly scheduling of public remarks and the inclusion of such in the agenda, anyone wishing to speak before the Board, either as an individual, or as a member of a group, should inform the Superintendent in writing of the desire to do so and of the topic to be discussed as early as possible, but in no event less than five days prior to the meeting.

Any individual desiring to speak shall stand and give his or her name and the group name, if any, that he or she represents. The presentation should be as brief as possible, and in no event shall such address exceed three minutes. Speakers may make statements about their particular concern with school operations and programs and shall observe appropriate decorum in doing so. The Board will not hear comments regarding individual students, personal complaints against particular school personnel or any person connected with the school system in public session.

At his or her discretion, the Board President may allow public comments from the floor at the end of the regular meeting agenda, subject to the limitations above. The Board President may terminate any comments that do not conform to the criteria specified above, or for other good cause. [amended October 3, 2019]
