Turkey Shoot Success



Mrs. Houck's Career Portals class had a special demonstration last week from the local Air Evac team. Shortly after 12 the helicopter circled in and landed on the 7th grade practice football field.

There was a paramedic, flight nurse, and a pilot that each talked about the requirements for joining Air Evac. They also gave the starting salary for a flight nurse which is \$50,000. The pilot also said the distances the helicopter could fly roughly 200 miles on a tank of fuel depending on flying conditions.

There was about a 10 minute question session where things Isuch as how you become an Air Evac patient were answered.

Students were allowed to climb inside the helicopter and check out the equipment. The crew left during 6th period.
